LAB Summit had definite Ohio flavor

On March 16, I joined five other Ohioans (the most ever to participate) in the fifth annual League of American Bicyclists Summit in Washington, D.C.

The summit includes a host of seminars and one day on Capitol Hill talking with representatives and senators about important bicycling legislation.

The summit always concludes with a massive bicycle ride through the streets of Washington. This year the ride was special for Ohioans. It started in Garfield Circle (named for President James Garfield,

an Ohioan). Garfield Circle is in front of the Capitol in the shadow of the huge equestrian statue of President Ulysses S. Grant, also from Ohio. The Traveling Museum of the Bicycle Museum of America in New Bremen, Ohio, was displaying its bikes in the circle.

During the summit, I gave a presentation on my work as a member of the National Committee on Uniform Traffic Laws and Ordinances. This committee is responsible for updating the Uniform Vehicle Code, which all states use as a model for their own vehicle laws. I have represented the Ohio Bicycle Federation and have worked with a representative of the League of American Bicyclists in making the Uniform Vehicle Code more bicyclist-friendly. Many changes still must be made, since the bicycle has been redefined in the code as a vehicle.

I also attended the LAB Board meeting on March 19. This board meeting was the first for new Region 4 Director Mike Abrams of Bolivar, Ohio. Mike is also secretary of the OBF. During the 2004 LAB Board meeting in Washington, I suggested Abrams as a successor to former District 4 Representative Brenda Pulley of Shaker Heights (near Cleveland), who moved to Georgia recently. In addition to Ohio, Region 4 includes Michigan, Indiana and Illinois.

The six Ohio representatives to the summit also included Doug Hamilton, the owner of BikeWise bike shop in Oxford; Cincinnati bike lawyer Steve Magas; and Ken LaDell and John Gideon of Columbus. 

DCC Meeting Highlights

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Tuesday, March 2, at CHOICES Inc., 8517 N. Dixie Drive, Butler Twp. In attendance were board members Anita Patten, Sheri Noer, Michele Rizzardi, Walter Burton, Dale Williamson, Claire Lea, Kay Wert Minardi, Chris Brown and Barry Schroeder. DCC members Ben VanWye and Clara Minardi were also present. Vice President Chuck Smith and Webmaster Rob Pretzinger were not in attendance.

The meeting came to order at 6:30 p.m.

The official appointment of the new DCC secretary by President Anita Patten was the first order of business. Sheri Noer, resident of Brookville and an avid cyclist and triathlete, has agreed to serve as the new DCC secretary.

Minutes of the Feb. 1 business meeting were accepted with no revisions. The acceptance was moved by Williamson and the second was made by Wert Minardi.

Patten's president's report was extensive and included:

- She had received a request from Henry Powers of the Five Rivers MetroParks bike-patrol program for a \$180 donation. The funds are to be used by the bike patrol to buy tubes for assisting bikeway riders throughout the area. A motion was made by Kay Wert Minardi to consider the donation with a DCC membership application attached to the tubes. Williamson seconded. There was no further discussion, and the motion was approved unanimously.

- She had received a request that the DCC hold a Ride of Silence, commemorating cyclists who have been injured and died in motorist-cyclist accidents, at 7 p.m. May 18. The event is on the same evening as a U.S. Air Force Blue Streak Time Trial (since changed), but the time trial is not a club event. It was agreed to hold a Ride of Silence, and Patten said she would organize the event and suggested that Chuck Smith handle the media notification.

- The Feb. 12 DCC banquet was a big success. Master of ceremonies Brian Davis did an admirable job, and all were pleased with his participation. It was suggested that he be asked to participate again next year. The cost of the awards came to about \$1,000.

- The design of the club jersey that was presented at the banquet was discussed. The board decided the text "www.daytoncyclingclub.org" should run up the side of the body. The approximate cost of the jersey is expected to be \$75. Jersey samples from Bikatac were presented. Patten said she will finalize the ordering process.

- The 2003 audit is done. Wert Minardi requested the results to publish in the *Spoke 'N' Link*.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi reported that insurance coverage for Calvin's Challenge will cost \$1,023. She said the official switch to Key Bank from Fifth Third has been completed, and a decision needs to be made on the CD, which matures later in March. Patten requested that it be moved to Key Bank to keep all of the club's accounts at one bank.

Calvin's Challenge Representative Barry Schroeder said he had talked to event Co-Director Ann McKinley, who said 58 riders had signed up. She's looking for extra volunteers. The event still might get \$1,000 in sponsorship money from Chris Stauffer Homes. Patten and Ann McKinley have been discussing a risk-management policy for the event, and Patten will continue to follow up on this issue.

Huffman Spring Classic Director Dale Williamson said the application was almost complete and would be uploaded to the Web site soon. Unsolicited sponsors have added \$1,200 to the bottom line. Thanks go to the Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority, Lindemann Physical Therapy, The Noer Group and Tim Williams Auto Sales. Williamson added that Filbrunn's Pond remains the central loop/rest stop location, and the route map has been laid out on one page.

Touring Captain Walter Burton said he needs to verify ride leaders' names, as he suspects that he has been getting requests to list rides by non-members.

Burton also said he receives information on various commercial tours, and he feels uncomfortable listing them. It was agreed by all that we shouldn't list such tours unless they are paid advertising. Any member interested can contact Walter for information on such rides in the region, and he will share the information he has.

Finally, Burton asked what the board thought about periodically featuring specific club rides in order to promote the rides and expose club members to new rides. A suggestion was made that we work with ride leaders to feature a specific ride each month. It would be an opportunity to get members to meet and mingle. All agreed. Burton will seek rides to give special mention in his monthly column.

Wright Ride Co-Director Kay Wert Minardi said her meeting with Carillon Historical Park officials was postponed because she was ill. It will be rescheduled.

Membership Director Claire Lea said the club had 315 adults, one junior, 349 members in 131 families and seven honorary members for a total of 672 members. This was up from last month. Claire announced that she received a check for \$133.80 from Dorothy Lane Market's Good Neighbor program.

She also said thINK Printing and Graphics and Early Express Mailing Services deserve a special thank you from the DCC. Our printers and mailers really go the extra mile for us. ThINK even picked up the *Spoke 'N' Link* disk from Kay's house when she was ill. Everyone is pleased with their services.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown said the Kettering Spur of the Creekside Trail is getting a new name: Iron Horse Trail. He added that the trail will eventually connect to Centerville's trail (the Kettering Spur used to dead-end at Woodbine Avenue but now will eventually turn east and head to Centerville). It was suggested that Brown talk to city of Dayton officials about better marketing of its trails.

In old business, possible affiliation with the Greater Ohio Area Tandem Society was discussed. Patten asked if we needed to do something formally with GOATS. They would like their members to be able to utilize some DCC member benefits. The board agreed that it needs clarity on exactly what the GOATS want from the DCC. It was also agreed that we should encourage their members to become members of the DCC. It appears that the GOATS would like to have newsletter space as well.

It was suggested that we consider a tandem director position. Such a position would need to be created, but that would not be difficult. Patten will follow up with GOATS President Jack Bernstein.

In new business, Burton asked if time trials are covered by our club insurance. The answer is yes, as long as we don't charge a fee for participation.

Williamson asked if our club insurance is in place. He was assured that our insurance is up to date for all current rides. The club, board and ride leaders are all covered.

Wert Minardi moved to adjourn the meeting, and Williamson seconded. The meeting was adjourned at 7:53 p.m. 🚲

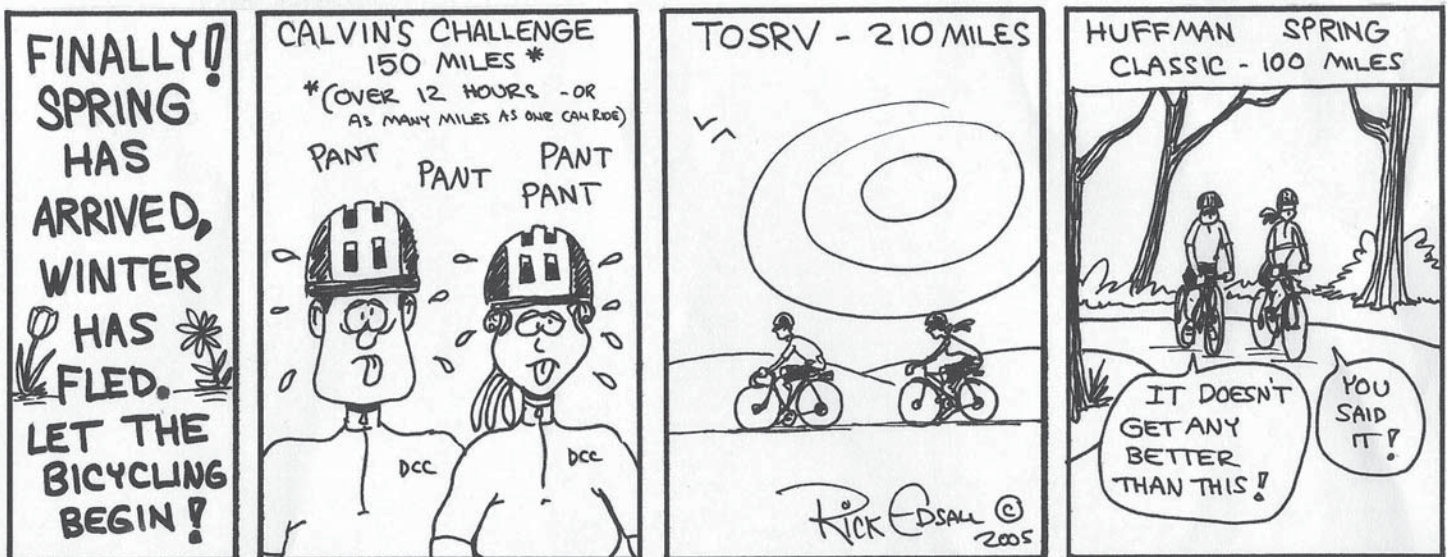

Return to a time when bicycles were new, cars were few and these covered bridges were in their youth. The youngest covered bridges on this ride are more than 100 years old! (Thankfully, we have paved roads now.) For almost 30 years this budget tour has been celebrating the bridges' heyday.

START: 8 a.m. Saturday, June 4, at the Westbrook Elementary School parking lot in Brookville, Ohio. Registration is from 7 to 8 a.m. We may be gone riding already if you arrive later than 8!

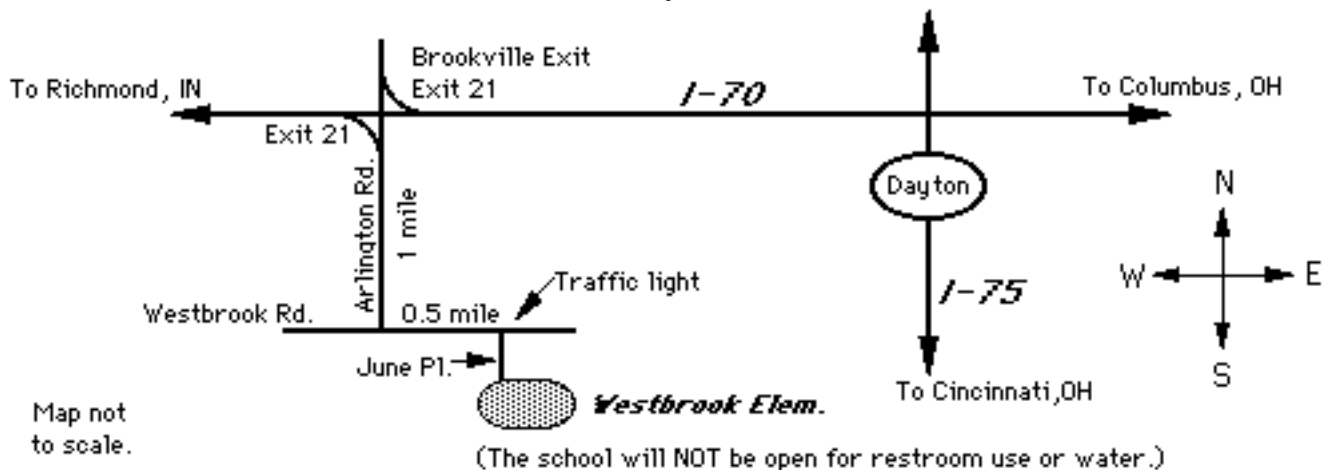
NOTE: No restrooms or water are available at the start. Fast-food restaurants, gas stations and a Days Inn motel (telephone 937-833-4003) are near the highway exit.

ROUTES: 23 miles (two covered bridges), 45 miles (five covered bridges), 74 miles (seven covered bridges), 103 miles (10 covered bridges), on rolling to hilly terrain.

FACILITIES: No food or drinks are provided. All routes pass through small towns where water, restrooms, snack foods, etc., are available at "quickmarts" and restaurants. Bring money or your own food. No SAG service will be provided, so bring a pump, patch kit and tools and know how to use them. Be prepared for bad weather.

COST: \$4 per person, which pays for the route marking and a map. A commemorative ride patch will be available for an additional \$1.

Quick check reduces risk of ruined ride

Nothing can ruin a wonderful trail ride like having your bicycle break down. While you can't avoid every piece of broken glass you might find on the trails, you can minimize the chances of having difficulty while riding. One way is the ABC Quick Check. This is a fast and easy check of your bicycle that should be done before *any* ride. I have neglected this practice and have paid the price for it.

A stands for Air. Checking the pressure in your tires ensures a smooth ride with less resistance. It also helps to avoid dreaded pinch flats.

B is for Brakes. The cables can stretch over time, causing braking to be less effective. You also may be working on your wheels and forget to reconnect the brakes when you're finished — I speak from experience!

C refers to both the chain and the cranks. Make sure your chain is clean and *lightly* oiled (remove any excess that can attract dirt and dust). Firmly grasp your cranks and give them a shake to see if there is any play or movement. The cranks should be solid.

"Quick" reminds you to check the quick-releases on your wheels, brakes and seat, if applicable. Refer to your owner's manual for determining that quick-releases are tight and secure.

"Check" is a "catch-all" for anything else you should inspect: your bike computer, mirrors, bottle cages, clipless pedals, etc.

The ABC Quick Check won't guarantee that you never get a flat or have an accident, but it will help you avoid some of the more common bike problems found on the trails.

Web site helps bikeway pedalers

Pedalopolis.com is a site where you can check on recreation trail conditions in southwest Ohio. It mostly focuses on the Little Miami Scenic Trail but also lists information on other trails in the area. Becoming a member is free and allows you to post your own information about trail conditions.

The URL is www.pedalopolis.com. There is a link to it on the DCC Web site as well.

By posting frequent trail conditions the site helps not only local cyclists but out-of-town visitors to navigate our trail system.🚲

Bikeway Mileage Report

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

Ride classification and selection

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include a classification (Class) for each ride. Ride classification and length of the ride (Miles) are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The class is the minimum average speed a rider is expected to be able to handle. Ride leaders choose class and distance, as well as date and location, when completing ride-scheduling forms. Ride leaders are responsible for riding with riders unfamiliar with the route and/or supplying maps. Area is determined by the starting point of the ride. **Questions? 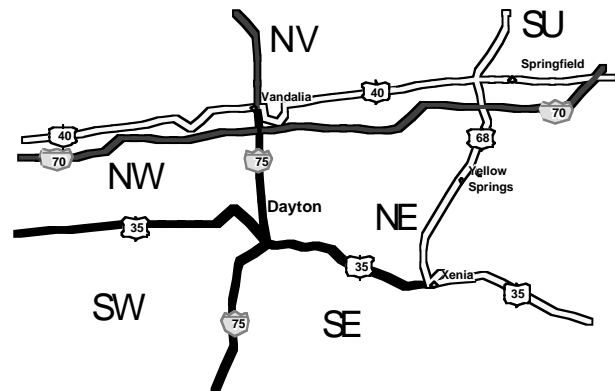

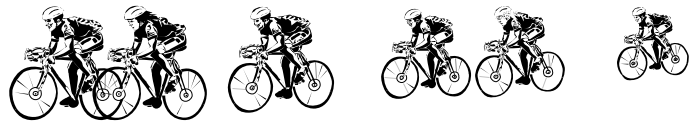
