Big- and little-wheelers keep Calvin's Challenge interesting

Calvin's Challenge can be as early as April 30 and as late as May 6. This year it was on April 30, and we suffered for the early date with predictions of cold weather, rain and 30 mph winds. Fortunately, the predictions were wrong and the winds stayed below 20 mph, it never rained and the temperature hung around 50 degrees all day.

There were 204 bikes and 214 riders registered for the 14th annual Calvin's 12-Hour Challenge. These included eight tandems, one triple, three trikes, eight recumbents, two hand cycles, two high-wheelers and one tiny bike with training wheels (more on this later). Riders' ages ranged from 14 to 78, with an average age of 45.4 years.

Evey Williams (sister of Bob Bachtel, the rider who was killed in

last year's event) acted as official starter and said a few words at the start. Then, following our tradition, she led the riders off to the tennis courts at the edge of the school grounds. Bob's mother was also at the event. Evey rode the same 62 miles Bob rode in 2004 and finished by laying a wreath at the accident site.

Twenty-year-old Brian Nieport has been riding this event since he was 13, holds the 15-19 record at 242 miles and this year returned with some friends from the University of Cincinnati Race Team to try for some new records. A lead pack immediately formed around Brian's team and they rushed off, completing the first 25 miles in 1:15.

The lead pack eventually dwindled down to Brian, Robert Schoettinger and Adam Fuson on a tandem and Race Across AMERICA veteran Danny Chew. The group continued to circulate smoothly for the remainder of the day, finishing with 242 miles. It was not enough for an overall record on this windy day, but Schoettinger & Fuson did raise the male-male tandem record from 228 to 242 miles.

It was a long day and a lot happened, but here are some highlights:

- RAAM veteran Matt Bond's 4.5-year-old son, Ben, was at the starting area riding around on his little bike with training wheels. His mother, Sharon, told him it would be OK to follow the group out to the end of the school driveway when the race started. But young Ben got caught up in the excitement and just kept going, heading off down Selma Pike with Sharon sprinting after him. He managed to drop Sharon and rode about a quarter of a mile before pulling off the road and crashing. Ernie Nieport, sagging for his son, stopped his van and consoled Ben until his mom caught up. Looks like Ben inherited some good bike genes from his dad.

- South Solon, site of the 25-mile checkpoint, picked April to install a new sewer system. The work was to be completed before the race, but when we got back to Ohio on April 23, the main street was totally wrecked. The construction company was very cooperative and promised to do as much as possible to help us out. They came through for us (the supervisor was driving the sweeper Friday) and cleared the street in time for the race.

- Nancy Guth crashed 40 miles into the first lap and sustained a mild concussion, major road rash and a sprained wrist. She continued on for another 174 miles for a total of 214 to win her age class and female high mileage.

- Richard Lawrence, 78, returned to win his age class with 128 miles. He brought his 46-year-old

son Joel along this year, and *he* rode 192 miles. Looks like bike genes run in this family, too.

- This was the first year we required rear-view mirrors. We expected some disagreement on this issue, but had only two complaints. Folks from The Bicycle Stop were on hand Friday and Saturday with a good supply but sold only a handful of mirrors. Apparently most people came prepared. We did see a couple of creative installations that at least honored the letter of the rule, if not the intent.

- Speaking of "not getting older, just getting better," take a look at the male 70-74 class. Lew Meyer won with 206 miles, his personal best. RAAM veteran (and sponsor) Chris Stauffer, who held the age class record at 192, was off his pace due to a recent bout with the flu. Five-time Ironman Triathlon veteran Dave Robertson, 74, took third place.

- Paris-Brest-Paris veteran Elizabeth Wicks completed her first Calvin's Challenge and set a new women's 70-74 record at 164 miles. She promised to return next year and raise it even higher.

- Hand cyclist John Enrietto, in his first Calvin's

Challenge, won a gold medal with 121 miles after Ann fed him several spoonfuls of peanut butter to fuel him up for his last two laps.

• We kidnapped Valerie Van Griethuysen Friday night and made her spend two hours in the dark helping Ann mark holes in South Solon and sweeping off the last of the gravel. Despite all this, on Saturday she rode 192 miles and won a gold medal in her age class and was second in the women's overall mileage rankings.

• After 14 years, we retired the old "Official Calvin's Time" analog clock and replaced it with an LED countdown timer with 12-inch numbers. To help

honor the winners, Jim Lemaster built podiums for the awards ceremony, which for the first time was held indoors.

Thanks to all of the faithful Dayton Cycling Club members who volunteered to give up their time to help make this race happen. And thanks to our generous sponsors Chris Stauffer Homes, Haldex, Lindemann Physical Therapy and The Bicycle Stop. Special thanks to Barry Schroeder and Kathy Williams for working almost 24 hours straight on Friday and Saturday.

We'll see you next year on May 6! 🚲

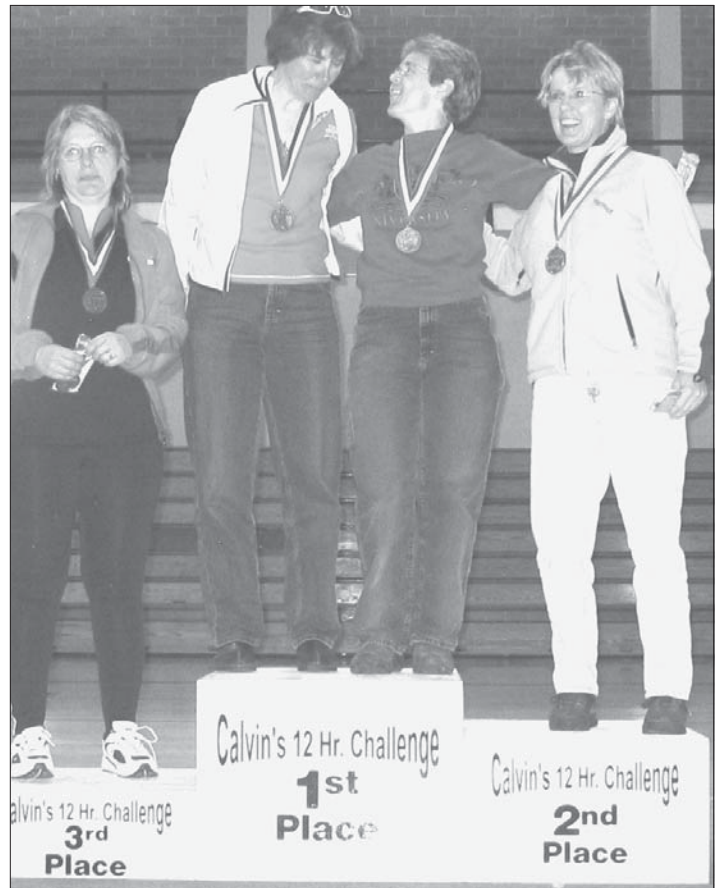

"Duck" took several breaks during the ride, but his ability and desire to ride have not waned. I was told that he keeps his bike in his room at his assisted-living facility. Not long ago, the staff found him out in the hallway attempting to mount his bike, not exactly sure where he was riding to.

The birthday ride generated a few stories:

- As I found my place in the gathering for the group picture, Gov. Bob Taft came over and stood beside me. Dayton Cycling Club member Nick Zantal, who was standing by the photographer, looked our way, pointed and shouted, "I voted for you!" Taft replied, "Thank you!" Nick said, "Not you! — Anita!" (The League of American Bicyclists ballots had just come out, and I am running for an at-large position.) It's tough being the governor when you're standing next to a president.

- While talking with Taft during the ride, I asked if he had any retirement plans. He said he wants to live with a bike path in his back yard. I said Dayton would be a great place to live and added that he could run for president of the DCC, as I know there is soon to be an opening. Chuck Smith could run Taft's publicity campaign, and I would volunteer to be Taft's campaign manager. Later at Frisch's, however, Taft announced that he was squashing all rumors and will not run for DCC president. It's tough

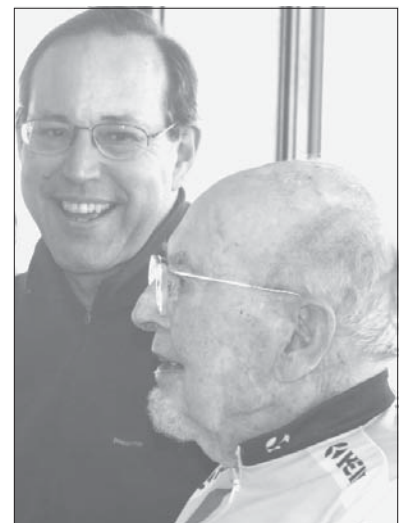
moving from governor to president.

Take advantage of opportunity to commute intermodally

Thanks to Dayton Cycling Club member Jim Foster of the Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority and federal funds available through Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds, we can ride the RTA buses for free with our bikes from June through August again this year.

This comes in handy when you ride somewhere not far from a bus line and it starts to rain. It frees you a bit from having to worry so much about weather reports for your return trips, since you can take the bus if the weather becomes inclement.

The U.S. Senate is developing its version of the federal transportation bill, called SAFETEA. You might wish to contact our senators to urge them to support strong CMAQ funding so this and other CMAQ programs may continue.

Bikeway Mileage Report

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

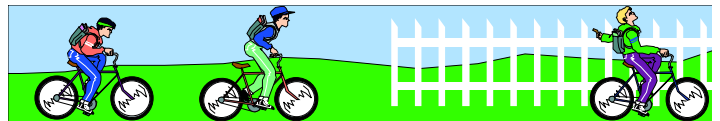

Ride classification and selection

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include a classification (Class) for each ride. Ride classification and length of the ride (Miles) are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The class is the minimum average speed a rider is expected to be able to handle. Ride leaders choose class and distance, as well as date and location, when completing ride-scheduling forms. Ride leaders are responsible for riding with riders unfamiliar with the route and/or supplying maps. Area is determined by the starting point of the ride. **Questions? 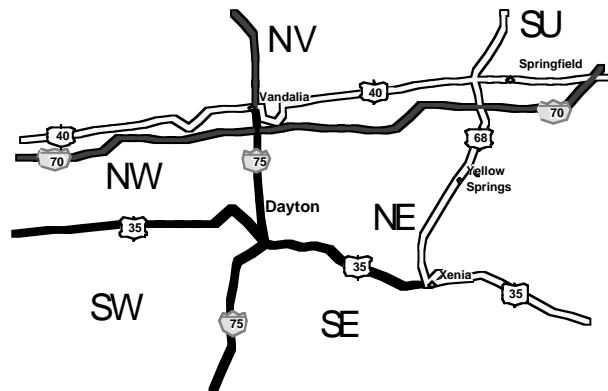

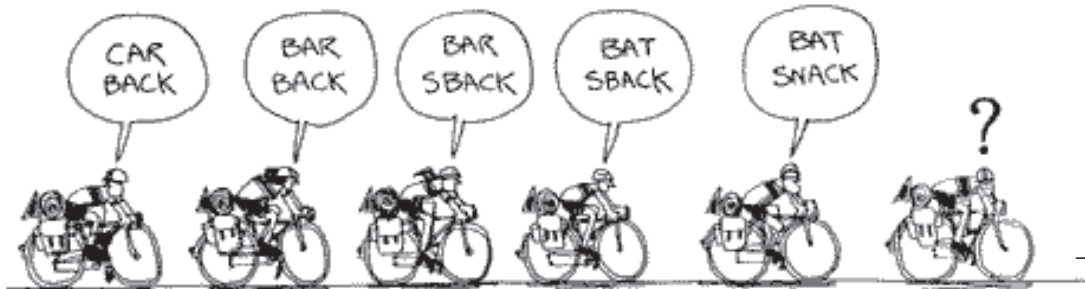

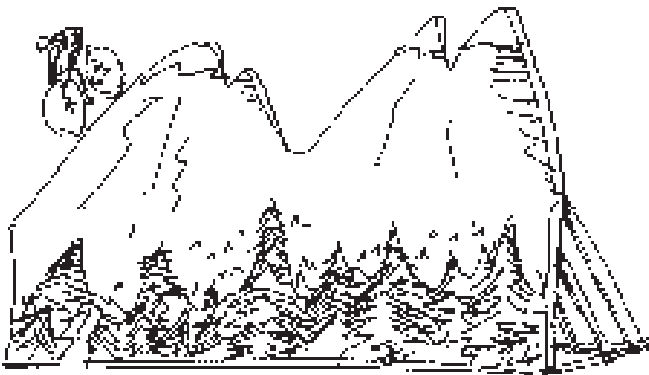
