DCC board gets a new look

The Dayton Cycling Club Nominating Committee on Oct. 16 counted the votes cast in the election for the 2006 DCC Board of Directors. Bob Tackett chaired the committee.

Sixty-nine votes were cast, of which 57 were ruled valid. The votes that were not counted were disqualified because the voters left off the required identifying information on the exterior of their envelopes, enclosed two ballots or had allowed their membership to lapse.

Ben VanWye was elected president with 48 votes. Anita Patten and Dwaine Wheeler received two votes each. Myrna Hayward was elected vice president with 54 votes. Brenda Taulbee was elected secretary and Sheri Noer was elected membership director with 52 votes each. Michele Rizzardi was re-elected treasurer with 51 votes. Walter Burton and Dale Williamson received 54 votes for touring captain and Huffman Spring Classic director, respectively. Kay Wert

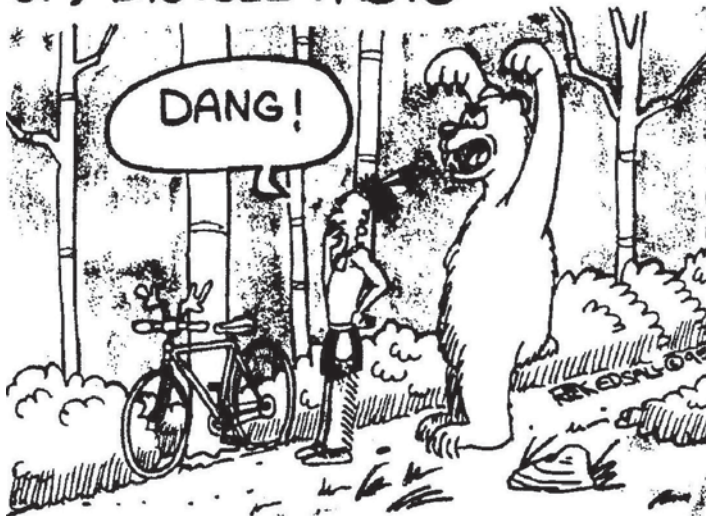
Minardi was re-elected Wright Wride director with 52 votes, while Mark Garlikov received one write-in vote. Bikeways Director Chris Brown and Calvin's Challenge Representative Barry Schroeder each were re-elected with 55 votes.

In the only contested race, Harv Kiesel won the webmaster position with 40 votes to Dwaine Wheeler's 16. However, nobody was listed on the ballot for social director so Dwaine Wheeler with two write-in votes accepted the position. Mark Garlikov and Joan Rudy each received one write-in vote for social director.

John Bargerhuff, who announced at the last business meeting (after the ballots were published) that he would consider being the newsletter editor, won easily with four write-in votes. The husband-and-wife team of Mark Minardi and Kay Wert Minardi received one write-in vote.

The 2005 and 2006 boards will meet at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 2, at CHOICES Inc., 8517 N. Dixie Drive, Butler Twp. Directors should bring their proposed budgets for next year. 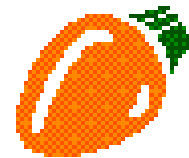

Ohio cyclists deserve uniform statewide regulation

While motorists operate according to the same rules throughout Ohio, we cyclists must ride according to the ordinances of our local jurisdictions.

Local control has resulted in many bad local cycling laws, including an ordinance requiring us to hop off our bikes and walk across every Vandalia intersection. When I brought this ordinance to the attention of the Vandalia City Council in 1994, not one council member knew the ordinance was on the city's books and they soon rescinded it. However, there are too many bad local laws across Ohio to correct. The answer is uniform statewide regulation of cycling, as we have for motorists.

State Rep. Arlene Setzer, R-Vandalia, soon will introduce a bill for the Ohio Bicycle Federation that will bring about statewide uniformity. Before its introduction, it will be known as Legislative Services Commission 126 0629-1. You may see the complete text on the OBF Web site at www.ohiobike.org.

Ohio cyclists mourn longtime advocate


Ohio cycling lost a great advocate with the passing of Ed Honton, who on Oct. 12 passed away peacefully after a long fight with leukemia.

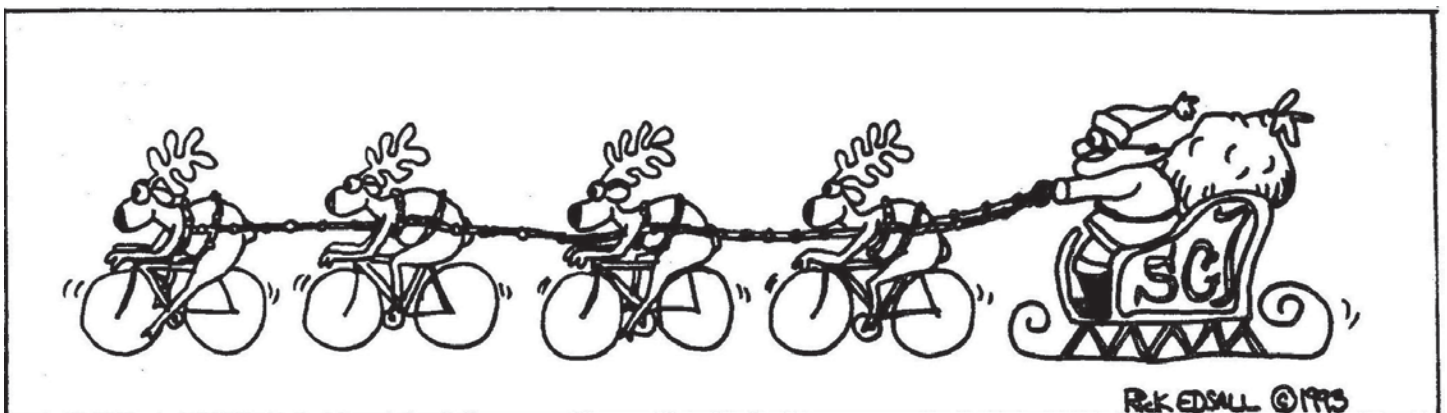
Mr. Honton was the first Ohio Department of Transportation bicycle and pedestrian coordinator and a co-founder of the Ohio Bicycle Federation. He was instrumental in pushing for the first cross-Ohio bicycle route, the Cardinal Trail. He created the Ohio to Erie Trail Fund and pushed this mammoth trail linking Cincinnati, Columbus and Cleveland to two-thirds completion.

Mr. Honton received the OBF's Horace Huffman Award in 2000 for his outstanding promotion of bicycling for recreation and transportation.

Mr. Honton also contributed greatly to the betterment of cycling in the Miami Valley. Greene County and the city of Xenia used his Ohio to Erie Trail funding in acquiring Xenia Station and the railroad from Xenia to near Cedarville. Mr. Honton's Ohio to Erie Trail Fund also was important in acquiring the railroad corridor between South Charleston and London and a lease from Dayton Power and Light Co. from Cedarville to South Charleston.

Mr. Honton never wanted recognition for his efforts. A project's completion brought him a personal sense of accomplishment.

Ed Honton will live on in the hearts and minds of those who were lucky enough to know him. 



Blue Streak season ends on DCC note

Romance was in the air at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base on Sept. 20 as the eighth U.S. Air Force Blue Streak Time Trial season drew to a close.

Longtime Dayton Cycling Club members Valerie and Jim Paoloemilio celebrated their eighth anniversary that night. As Valerie said, "Today is our eighth wedding anniversary. We met each other on a bicycle ride and celebrated our anniversary with a time trial."

The Paoloemilios finished first among three tandem teams, averaging 24.42 mph by covering the 10 miles around the Area C flight line in 24 minutes, 34 seconds.

DCC member Richard Myers finished first overall, finishing in 20 minutes, 30 seconds for a blistering 29.27 mph. Myers pedaled his "streamliner" human-powered vehicle, a fully faired recumbent. He resembled an aircraft without wings as he left conventional bicycles in his dust. The 68-year-old Myers relies upon his aerodynamics to compete with much younger cyclists.

Myers said afterward, "I was slightly disappointed that I did not break 30 mph again, but I am still in the learning phase with this new streamliner."

"This was my second-fastest time, and I rode it different than my fastest time in July. I kept the top speed over 32 but failed to maintain high enough speed over the bumpier sections of the road. My front wheel is 16 inches, which is OK on smooth roads but gives me a lot of trouble on rough sur-

faces like the road we use for the BSTT."

Abe McNutt, 29, finished first among conventional bicyclists at 28.53 mph.

DCC member Alisa Meyer of Sidney placed first among DCC women and second among all Blue Streak women at 22.46 mph. 2005 DCC President Anita Patten finished behind Meyer at 21.82 mph.

The time trial results are listed on Page 13.

Bike routes lead to new adventures

I just picked up a book from the library, *Moon dust: In Search of the Men Who Fell to Earth*, by Andrew Smith. It reminded me of a time when America anticipated, in fact *expected*, to have a base on the moon by 2001. And what about the Pan Am shuttle, or the Hilton Hotel in the revolving space station, as seen in *2001: A Space Odyssey*?

So far, things haven't worked out the way they were envisioned. The space shuttle is more a truck than a passenger vehicle, and the International Space Station doesn't even have a Howard Johnson's.

Similarly, Ohio bicyclists look to a future in which all the recreation trails in the state, if not the entire country, are linked by a worldwide web of asphalt and concrete. Someday, we're told, it will be possible to ride from the Ohio River to Lake Erie on bike paths. We'll also have what has become a kind of "holy grail" of bike-path riding: loops! No more out-and-back rides. A cyclist will be able to ride from Dayton to Xenia, to Springfield, to New Carlisle, to Piqua and back to Dayton. Someday.

Today, however, our local paths are still fragmented. Plans are in the works to build trails in Centerville and connect them with a trail in Kettering. I have heard of Creekside Trail/"H-Connector"-type paths to connect the Great Miami and Little Miami trails at various points. Connecting the Mad River Trail at Eastwood Park to the Wright Brothers Bikeway (formerly the Kauffman Avenue Bikeway) continues to be discussed. The projected deadline for these projects is said to be 2007.

Meanwhile, cities such as Centerville and Beavercreek are working to create bike *routes*, using existing streets to connect schools, parks and shopping centers.


I recently discovered Beavercreek's first route of this sort while scouting a way to commute to my new job in Fairborn. I was riding the Creekside Trail to Grange Hall Road and, at Southview Avenue, just north of Dayton-Xenia Road, I saw a bikeway sign with a letter "A" on it. There was also a small green sign with a white, reflective arrow. Following several more of these arrows led me to the bike-path loop that runs around the Mall at Fairfield Com-

mons. According to Dayton Cycling Club members Roger and Lynn Brucker, who live nearby, this route is the first of many Beavercreek has planned.

"Other Beavercreek bikeways (letters B through I) have been mapped," Roger said. "A map will be published soon on the Web site (www.ci.beavercreek.oh.us) and in hard copy. Signs marking each bikeway are tentatively scheduled for two or so routes each year until completed. The signage for each route costs about \$1,500, and the delay is due to city budget constraints. Cyclists are invited to answer the bikeway questionnaire on the Web site (click "Take Our Bikepath Survey" in the right-hand menu)."

Consulting my street guide while at the Mall at Fairfield Commons revealed that I was very close to the Wright Brothers Bikeway. I merely had to get on Fairfield Road and ride over Interstate 675 (scary, with on and off ramps, but not the worst road I've been on), cross Colonel Glenn Highway and go around the E.J. Nutter Center to University Boulevard. Turning left, then right through a Wright State parking lot led to Kauffman Avenue, with the bike path right across the street.

As there is no curb on this part of Kauffman, riding through the grassy right-of-way onto the path is easy. A small, drivewaylike entrance would be nice, though; a number of cyclists use this route, which would justify paving the 4 feet or so from the path to the street.

Someday all of our recreation trails *will* be connected, perhaps even within our lifetimes. In the meantime, if you ride a street route that you like and that connects public places, why not see if your city or township would be willing to mark it as a bike route? If you find it convenient, others might as well.

Bikeway Mileage Report

Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

High gasoline prices push us to 2 wheels


While fitness and fun have always been great reasons for bicycle commuting, a third “F” (financial) now encourages us more than ever to take care of our business on two wheels instead of four. It seems that with gasoline prices averaging nearly \$3 per gallon, more of us are using our bikes for transportation.

The Dayton Cycling Club’s 7,159 commuting miles for September brought us to a total of 53,786 miles for the first nine months of 2005. This figure exceeds 12-month totals for seven of the 12 years I have been tracking DCC commuter mileage.

With three months remaining, I expect us to break our record of 61,474 transportation cycling miles set in 2001.

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include a classification (Class) for each ride. Ride classification and length of the ride (Miles) are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The class is the minimum average speed a rider is expected to be able to handle. Ride leaders choose class and distance, as well as date and location, when completing ride-scheduling forms. Ride leaders are responsible for riding with riders unfamiliar with the route and/or supplying maps. Area is determined by the starting point of the ride. **Questions? 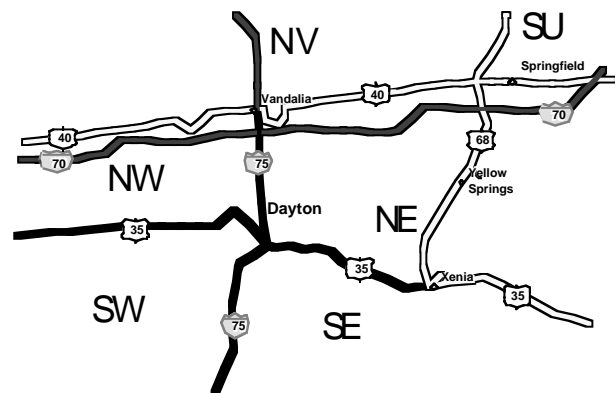
