There is still time to register for the Dayton Cycling Club's summer invitational event. Wright Wride Weekend 2006 is on Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 26-27.

The Saturday Wright Historical Tour is tailor-made for history lovers and aviation buffs. This is a guided, short-on-miles but long-on-education ride to a number of sites significant to the lives of the Wright brothers and aviation history. Don't expect to ride

fast or far, but be prepared to learn things about Dayton that you never knew before.

The 35th Wright Wride, on Sunday, is the DCC's traditional summer full-service, multiple-route invitational tour. We think our new route is a gem, starting at Carriage Hill MetroPark in Huber Heights and riding through rural Miami County (but avoiding the Tipp City Mum Festival routes). *(more on page 8)*

Board Meeting Highlights

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met June 7, 2006, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive, Vandalia, Ohio. In attendance were directors Ben VanWye, Anita Patten, Myrna Hayward, Brenda Taulbee, Michele Rizzardi, Kay Wert Minardi, Chris Brown, Dale Williamson, Dwaine Wheeler, Sally Pinnell and John Bargerhuff. Members Bob Pinnell, Clara Minardi, and Bob and Marian Eley also attended.

President Ben VanWye called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Treasurer Michelle Rizzardi distributed the May balance sheet for review. She recently added Myrna as a signer for the checkbook.

Dale Williamson, Huffman Spring Classic director, introduced Bob and Marian Eley, who are interested in running for the directorship when Dale's term is up this November. Dale would like to rent the shelter in Brookville now and requested the amount of \$125 to do so. The board agreed to renting the shelter in advance.

Sally Pinnell was officially recognized as the new membership director. Sally received all the membership items from Sheri on May 21, in-

cluding records, 2006 applications, keys, office supplies, DCC clothing, patches, and posters.

Sally reported that all 2006 new and renewal membership applications have been reviewed for accuracy and entered into the database. A total of 713 mailing labels were provided for the June newsletter. All 2006 membership card mailings were completed as of May 31. Various items ordered by applicants have been mailed.

Sally said that as of the end of April, club membership totaled 334 single adults, plus 333 family members, two junior members and 11 honorary members for a total of 690. Finally, Sally gave special thanks for the many hours that her husband, Bob, contributed to getting everything updated.

Newsletter Editor John Bargerhuff asked if a financial report is to be printed for each club event. It was agreed that each director should submit such a report following their event for insertion in the newsletter.

Chris Brown, bikeways director, reported that the first bike-in for the year is scheduled for June 24 from noon to 2 p.m. at Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek.

Wright Wride Director Kay Wert Minardi has a draft of the application form. She will designate the pre-registration deadline two weeks before the event. After that date the price goes up five dollars. Five Rivers MetroParks and the National Park Service are both excited about having us at their sites.

Social Director Dwaine Wheeler is having the Dayton Cycling Club picnic July 9 at Eastwood MetroPark from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. This will be a combination picnic and ride class qualifier to earn club patches.

The second social event of the year will be combined with the Cincinnati Cycling Club and the Oxford cluster on Aug. 12-13 at Hueston Woods State Park. There will be camping and outdoor activities starting at 1 p.m. Saturday at Group Campground No. 1. The picnic will be Sunday, with lunch beginning at noon at the Hedgerow Picnic Area.

Dwaine also submitted his budget for 2006. Anita Patten moved to approve an extra \$200 for the combined picnic with the CCC and Oxford cluster. Motion carried.

There was no old business to report.

Dayton Cycling Club Board Meeting Highlights, continued:

Under new business, Sally said there is a problem with members ordering clothing on the application forms. She would like to have the clothing field removed from the application form. As an alternative ordering method, an ad or announcement could be placed in the *S'n'L* and on the Web site. Bob and Marian volunteered to store and mail the shirts. Ben moved that the board accept their resolution to do this. Approval was unanimous. Kay will reorder the T-shirts.

Kay presented a budget for the SAG service that Mark Minardi will be providing for the DCC members participating in the Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure this year. Presently there are 30 people signed up. She expects the total number may end up at about 45 people. Anita moved to accept the GOBA truck budget. Motion carried.

Kay announced that the League of American Bicyclists has named the Dayton Cycling Club the regional club of the year for the district. Everyone agreed that Kay could proceed and supply the requested information to be published in the *American Bicyclist* magazine.

Ben received a letter from Henry Powers of the Five Rivers MetroPark Volunteer Patrol, requesting \$200 for inner tubes to replenish the supply for volunteers assisting cyclists on the MetroPark paths. A card is supplied with each inner tube listing all the sponsors, so this donation helps promote the club. Kay moved to supply the money for the tubes, and the motion carried.

Myrna brought up the subject of poor signage on the Wolf Creek bike-way. She discussed several ways to improve the signs. Ben will discuss

this with Greg Brumitt of Five Rivers Outdoors and report back.

Kay reported that Rick Smith has received a request from K&G Bike Center to purchase a full-year 1/8-page ad. Rick asked that DCC board members visiting bike shops mention that we have low rates and that we would love to have more advertising. Kay said she would send us all with pricing information.

Brenda Taulbee distributed the secretary's report for review. Changes were suggested and the minutes were approved as revised.

Ben moved to adjourn at 7:46 p.m. Dwaine seconded. The next meeting will be July 5, 2006, at the Vandalia Justice Center.

These minutes were approved by the DCC Board on July 5, 2006.

...and as the flood waters did rise, John Patterson looked out to the horizon and, in a resounding voice, called out to the people, "Seek ye...The Far Hills!!!"

My family moved into Oakwood in 1968, when I was four years old. There was a sign near our house that said "Oakwood Bikeway." There must have been about 35 to 40 of the blue and white signs scattered throughout Oakwood, each with a small red triangle in the corner, indicating "turn left," "turn right" or "go straight ahead."

After my sister taught me to ride a bicycle, she and I once tried to ride the entire Oakwood Bikeway but it was too far for us (five miles!).

In fact, I never rode the Oakwood Bikeway until I took up bicycling again in 1998. At that point only 5 or

6 of the original signs remained (and none of the small red triangles) but I was able to get a copy of the route from the City Of Oakwood. Earlier this year I tried to get a copy of the route but no one at the city building seemed to know what I was talking about. Happily, I found I had marked the route in an old street guide.

Somewhere along the line a friend showed me a route in Kettering, which I also highlighted in my street guide. This route was a ten-mile loop and passed near the Oakwood Bikeway near Ridgeway Road. I used to think it was one of several "Kettering Bikeways," with their green and white signs, but a recent ride along this route revealed that no "Kettering Bikeway" signs are present – today I am not sure where this route may have originated.

I am planning a touring ride of these routes in a "figure-eight" pattern at

9:00 AM, Sunday, September 3, 2006. This will be a "D" Class ride with several hills and will count as Touring Miles (not Bike Path Miles). I have never been a "Ride Leader" before but, if things go well, I may make it a regular ride in 2007. The routes pass by many interesting places, homes and buildings including Hills & Dales and Houk Stream Parks, The Wright Brothers' "Hawthorne Hill" home, Oakwood Junior High School and Edwin D. Smith Elementary School.

The meeting place will be the parking area next to Smith Elementary School (1701 Shafor Blvd) on Telford Avenue, between Shafor Blvd. and Far Hills Ave. at 9:00AM on Sunday, September 3rd. Feel free to join me

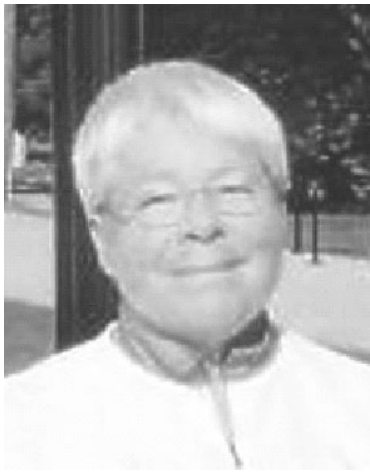

The Wright Historical Tour will start at the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center, which is part of the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park (<http://www.nps.gov/daav/>). The Tour includes a visit to Carillon Historical Park and the Wright Cycle Co. as well as lunch after the ride. Note that this ride is all urban (broken glass possible), and there are two fairly tough hills. Bring a lock to secure your bike while you are inside museums.

As for Sunday's Wright Wride, we have found a fun place for our food stop. Silver Lake Beach (<http://www.silverlakebeach.com/>) will be a great place to stop and smell the flowers throughout the day. Of course, you can eat the energy-stuffed snacks and summer picnic lunch we'll be packing. In addition, you can swim in the spring-fed lake; play games such as cornhole, volleyball and basketball; or just relax in the shade. Don't forget your bathing suit and sense of fun!

Loops of varying length will radiate from Silver Lake, with riders returning each time they complete a loop. By riding all of the loops plus the base loop from Carriage Hill, you

can complete a century. Choose from among the loops and personalize your ride. All of the standard distances are possible: 32 miles (metric half-century), 50 miles, 62 miles (metric century) and 100 miles — plus a few others. The Janet A. Long Memorial Meander is a 22-mile, out-and-back route for families and others who want to ride only a little bit and spend lots of time at Silver Lake.

Don't forget that after the ride, you can tour Carriage Hill (http://www.metroparks.org/_carriageHill/carriageHill.aspx), which illustrates 1880s farm life through displays, demonstrations, historical buildings and farm animals. There is even a general store in the visitor center that has an extensive penny candy counter for children.

Our sponsors - Lindemann Physical Therapy, Motor Technology Inc. and Van Atta Engineering - have

done their part to help make Wright Wride Weekend great. But we still need volunteers in order to keep up the high standards for which DCC invitationals are known. In most cases, you can ride at least one day of Wright Wride Weekend. Volunteers qualify for riders' and our gratitude and either a commemorative Wright Wride 2006 T-shirt or free registration for the ride of your choice.

Volunteer positions still open include (for both days) cookie bakers, SAG drivers and registration and food stop personnel; and (for the Wright Historical Tour) guides and escorts. Advocacy Avenues

House Bill 388 Crucial to Cyclists

The recent deaths of two Cincinnati area cyclists reemphasizes the need for legislation similar to this year's proposed House Bill 388. This bill would have increased penalties for right-of-way violations which often result in injury or death to bicyclists and motorcyclists.

Others who testified with me last spring offered heart rending and con-

vincing evidence of this need. A father testified that it was not possible to get a jury trial for the motorist who killed his motorcyclist daughter since the right-of-way violation which killed her was merely a fourth degree misdemeanor. Several motorcyclists testified on one leg – having lost the other in a collision with a motorist. They told of motorists receiving very little punishment for the right-of-way violation which was tried as a fourth degree misdemeanor.

Unfortunately, HB 388 was not passed this session. It is clear that we

will need to start over again with a new bill next session. We look forward to testifying again in support of this important bill.

Your Ohio Bicycle Federation is an active member of the Ohio Right-Of-Way Working Group, a group determined to make the legal system more serious about our deaths and serious injuries.

DCC Commuters Behind Last Year, Ahead of All Other Years

DCC commuters logged 32,991 miles for the first half of 2006. If we log the same number in the second half of 2006, we will have 6,000 fewer miles than the 72,105 we logged last year, but exceed all other years going back to 1993, when we began keeping track.

Could we be getting accustomed to the atrocious gasoline prices which drove us to break our previous mileage record by over 10,000 miles during the Gasoline Price Shock of 2005? This question may be answered as the mileage totals come in for the second half of this year.

Some say it does and some say there is no difference. If the bulk mailings cannot be delivered for some reason, they are not returned. Bulk mailings are also not forwarded. We don't know about problems unless we are contacted by the DCC member. The first class mailings (each costs the club \$1.11 postage + extra for handling) are supposed to be returned to DCC if they are not delivered for some reason.

The DCC board has decided to raise the First class fee from \$8.00 to \$11.00 effective Sep 1 2006. Any DCC member who has problems with any membership matter including receipt of the newsletter (Spoke'N'Link) should contact me via email, spinnell@ameritech.net, or telephone 937 426 7274.

Race Across America 2006

The 2006 version of Race Across America (RAAM) is now in the history books and RAAM cyclists have returned to their homes around the world. Once again area cycling enthusiasts have done their part by manning Station #42.

Former DCC president, Matt Bond, is the responsible party or captain for the station which is one of fifty-six stretched across the country on the 3,000 mile+ RAAM route. Matt is also the Time Tours National Manager for all the time stations and competed in three RAAMs himself. Time station staffs listen pretty closely when Matt tells us what riders and crews might want or need. Next to Matt, Cindy and John Foote probably put in the most time and effort at the station.

This year, due to a business trip of Matt's, Cindy and John were even put in charge for a time. In addition many club members and former members volunteer so there are always plenty of cycling fans around.

Lee Kreider and I signed up for Saturday night (Sunday morning) and Sunday night (Monday morning). The first two riders arrived and sped on by in the first hour Saturday night. Everyone else soon disappeared from the station and we were left with the yogurt and cookies and such to provide us our entertainment for the evening! We made do following the progress of all the riders using the WiFi from the Best Western motel and Lee's laptop. We were able to watch

a live video from a cam on the top of one of the rider's support vans. The next evening was a lot more exciting with eight different riders passing Station #42 plus at least four different floods from torrential rains. After the second flood, I decided I'd be dry again but not until my shift was over.

Because it is open 24 hours a day and because WiFi, food, overnight accommodations, gas, and other supplies are located within sight, Station #42 ranks high with RAAM people. Located this year in front of the Best Western just off of State Route 55 in Troy, the motel managers graciously allowed us the use of one of their rooms at no charge.

The location is 2359 miles into the route with 684 miles left to the finish in Atlantic City. Between Troy and Atlantic City are the mountains of West Virginia which I was surprised to hear are rated by riders as more difficult than the Rockies on this route. Just before our station is the Miami Valley's own contribution, Horseshoe Bend hill, just a hint of what awaits in West Virginia

As part of the staff of #42, I like to think that RAAM riders and crews look forward to reaching our site: whatever the time someone will be cheering and waving and hooting them onward. I like to think that counts or why else am I there at 3 in morning?

Our first solo rider was pretty cranky having just ridden through the WORST storm he had ever ridden

through, he said. Riders usually arrive singly but sometimes two riders arrive together. It's the sort of sport that attracts loners so riders often don't stay together.

This year 185 riders from 16 countries started the race in Ocean-side, California. This year's group included a Tour de France veteran, a 2-time Olympian, several Paralympians, a Mountain bike Hall-of-Famer, a World Duathlon Champion, a World UltraMan champion, a blind athlete, several athletes with diabetes and cancer survivors. Whew.

Riders compete solo or in teams of two, four, or eight. Most of the RAAM cyclists stop and go with a minimum of sleep, an hour or so a day as "needed". This is the first year for the new Enduro category where the cyclist must be off the bike for a total of 40 hours. This might be in response to two fatalities in the last three years. It's difficult to determine the causes of the deaths but certainly lack of sleep may have been a factor.

THE CHALLENGE LESS TAKEN

As those of you who know me can attest, I do a pretty high number of miles on my bike each year. For the past 10 years I have averaged over 12,000 miles per year, with between 5,000 and 8,000 of those DCC touring miles. More often than not I am not the fastest rider in the pack, nor do I do the longest rides on a particular day. In fact, prior to this year I had only ridden over 100 miles once in my life. Well, this year I turned 50 and having my mid-life crisis I decided to try a few new rides and push my limits a bit further than I had in the past.

At this year's Calvin's Challenge, (where I had set my previous high mileage of 150 in eight hours last year) the weather was good and the wind was only strong (instead of unbearable) so I went for it and rode the full 12 hours. I hooked up with several riders of similar ability and ended up with 228 miles, which was 2nd in my age group and a tie for 17th overall. When it was all over, I didn't feel all that bad and thought that I could have continued on if there had been more time.

About this same time I started looking at other challenges and found the brevets that are run by Randonneurs USA (www.rusa.org) and the Ohio Randonneurs (www.ohiorand.org). I did some research and found that these organizations are the U.S. and local affiliates of L'Audax Club Parisien, which runs the Paris-Brest-Paris randonnee.

These organizations are non-profits whose mission is to promote these and similar rides. RUSA and its affiliates offer a number of shorter brevets that qualify you to ride in the longer randonnees, such as PBP, Boston-Montreal-Boston, the Colorado Last Chance and the Cascade 1200. These rides are not competitive races; however, they must be completed within a stated time and are located in areas that offer challenging terrain. Therefore, you need to be in good shape and be able to ride independent of support from outsiders. In a number of the brevets you must also be willing to ride at night.

In order for you to participate in the longest randonnees, you must complete the shorter brevets in order of distance. The shorter brevets are 200, 300, 400, and 600 kilometers in length and will likely have between 7,000 and 22,000+ feet of climbing. The participants are given a cue sheet, which has all the road names, turn directions, and the distances the rider must travel in addition to the control stations.

Between April and July of this year I completed the 200, 300, 400, and 600 rides in southeast Ohio. The shortest was 128 miles and the longest was 377 miles. The longest included riding about eight hours during the night. All were hard, with lots of hills, tough navigation and variable weather conditions. The night riding exposed me to both kinds of wildlife, those found in nature and those found

around 2:00 am leaving the local tavern. Both turned out to be harmless. During several of the brevets I questioned my reasoning. After all of them I was very content with how I had done.

In participating in these events, I have learned that you can push yourself much further than you think just by deciding you are willing to do it. Each new challenge allows you to take a step further along, so that what you had thought to be beyond you really isn't. In doing this I have learned to break the challenge down into smaller parts and then finish each part one at a time. The most recent brevet was 600 kilometers, which I looked at as three 200 kilometer rides. Last year a 200 kilometer ride would have been a challenge. This year, with a break after each 200 kilometer segment, I was able to go out and do another.

Now that I have finished the 200 to 600 kilometer brevets, I have qualified to apply to ride the longer randonnees, which are 1200 kilometers in length and have a time limit of 90 hours. Does this seem appealing to me? Yes it does. Will I take the next step and ride one of these marathons? I don't know. Do I really want to push myself that hard for that long? I don't know. I think I will give it a few days before I decide on what will be the next big challenge for me. In the short term I have signed up for RAIN, 160 miles across Indiana.

or for accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.

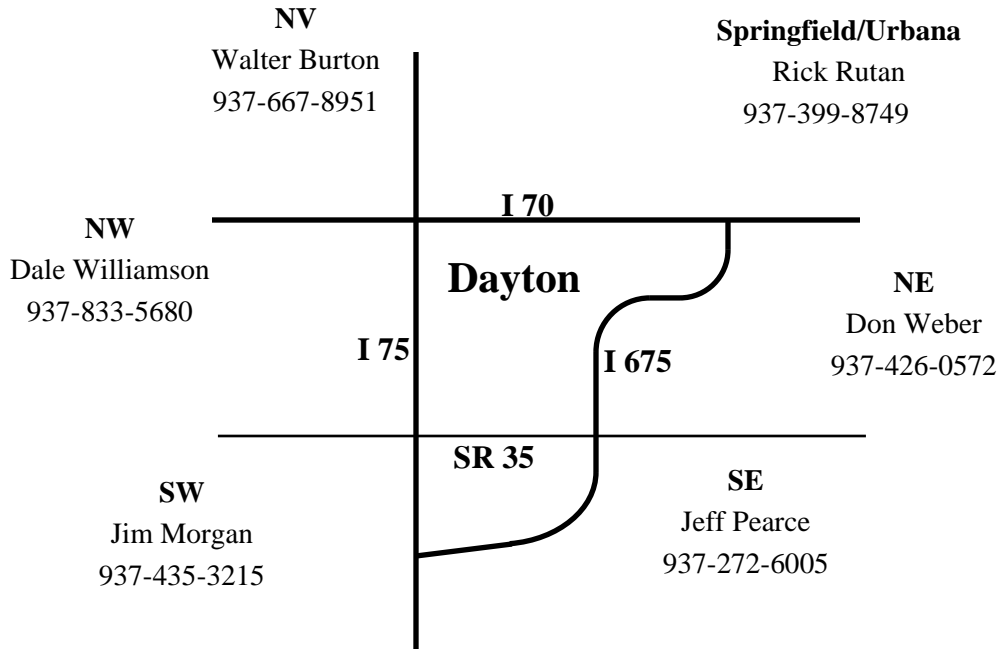
