A company called Alta Planning and Design, based in Portland, Ore., has been working with the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission, the Miami Conservancy District, Five Rivers MetroParks and the Miami County Parks District to evaluate and expand the bikeways, routes and lanes in the Miami Valley. I attended two public meetings, May 22 in Beavercreek and May 23 at Cox Arboretum, at which ideas and plans for the future of our recreation trails were discussed.

# DCC Meeting Minutes

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Wednesday, May 2, at a picnic table behind the Wright Cycle Co., 22 S. Williams St., Dayton. In attendance were directors John Bargerhuff, Chris Brown, Bob Eley, Myrna Hayward, Harv Kiesel, Sally Pinnell, Michele Rizzardi, Kay Wert Minardi, Dwaine Wheeler and Tom Wilson. DCC members Clara Minardi and Bob Pinnell and guests Brenda Gibson and Hans Landefeld of the Miami Conservancy District also were present.

Vice President Myrna Hayward called the meeting to order at 6:44 p.m.

Miami Conservancy District Public Relations Manager Gibson spoke about the Drive Less, Live More campaign sponsored by the Miami Conservancy District, Five Rivers MetroParks, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission and the Greater Dayton Regional Transportation Authority. Gibson briefed the board on the events that will be going on in May and June as part of this campaign. Included will be a River Ride; several Bike-to-Work Days; and contests to urge people to use alternate transportation — walking, bicycling and riding buses. Rather than persuading people to give up their cars for a whole month, the campaign seeks to get people to give up their cars for one day at a time. Gibson described several features on the Drive Less, Live More Web site ([drivelesslivemore.org](http://drivelesslivemore.org)) such as interactive maps and a driving cost calculator. Webmaster Harv Kiesel said he would link the DCC Web site with the Drive Less, Live More site.

Landefeld, manager of the conservancy district's river corridor and special projects, said the Miami Conservancy District, the MVRPC, Five Rivers MetroParks and the Miami County Park District are studying the trail system to determine what is missing from it and improve it. Among the goals are to fill in the missing parts of the trail system, connect more neighborhoods to the network and make the trail system easier to use. It is estimated that the study will take about a year to complete. Landefeld said input from area cyclists is very important to this effort, and he urged DCC members to speak up. In response to a question, Landefeld said a regional signage plan has been designed by the con-

servancy district and the various municipalities along the trails, and that will be incorporated in the regional trail plan.

Secretary Kay Wert Minardi presented the minutes from the March 7 business meeting. Kiesel moved to accept them, and Sally Pinnell seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

DCC member and National Park Service Ranger Arthur Currence called during the meeting to apologize for forgetting about the meeting and not being present to open the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center, where the meeting had been scheduled.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi said she paid a bill for \$192 to pay for 200 new medical information carrier kits. She is increasing the membership budget to include that expense. The DCC's share of ex-

penses for the Evening With Frankie Andreu was \$998.02. She had not been present at the meeting when the board approved that expenditure, and Wheeler said \$1,500 had been approved. Rizzardi also said she had received a request to add \$300 to the Huffman budget. Huffman Co-Director Bob Eley said the final cost of the event T-shirts was \$300 more than the original estimate. Wert Minardi moved and Wheeler seconded, and the board unanimously approved. Wert Minardi moved to accept the treasurer's report, Brown seconded, and the board unanimously approved.

Membership Director Sally Pinnell said 19 new members joined between April 4 and May 1. She said the DCC consists of 310 family members in 125 families, 277 adult members, one junior member and six honorary members, for a total of 594. She said membership is down from last year at the same time, but 66 memberships expired in April and she should receive many renewals in May.

Sally said she will have a display at the Huffman Spring Classic and will have membership applications available. She ordered coloring books about bicycle safety from the Ohio Department of Public Safety to give children at the tour. She added that Beverly Owens will sell DCC jerseys and T-shirts.

Sally said she had received 200 new medical information carrier kits for members' bike helmets. The kits cost the DCC 96 cents each. They will be distributed to new members for free; if anybody needs a new kit, they will be sold for \$2 each to cover their cost plus postage and handling. Sally intends to write about the kits for the June *S'n'L*.

Newsletter Editor John Bargerhuff said the first-class delivery of newsletters occurred that day, and the standard delivery should take place in the next day or two. He said Wert Minardi would be taking over the newsletter starting with the June issue. In answer to a question from Bob Pinnell, Wert Minardi said the deadline for editorial material generally will be the 10th of the month, and the advertising deadline will be the 15th.

Webmaster Harv Kiesel said he had reached an agreement concerning the Web site with the Cincinnati Cycle Club. The CCC will link to all of our major rides, and Harv will link to all of the CCC's invitationals. Kiesel added that he had added Huffman Spring Classic sponsor Subaru's logos and information to the Web site.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown had nothing to report.

Touring Captain Tom Wilson said he has added a few mountain-bike rides to the DCC ride list.


Eley said there will be a pizza party for Huffman volunteers at 6:30 p.m. May 13 at Carmello's Pizza.

Wright Wride Director Dwaine Wheeler said his application form will include a \$4 discount for DCC members, a line for people to join the DCC, and a line for people to give donations. He plans to have a commemorative patch this year, and a very nice limited-edition jersey. Wheeler probably will start the Sunday tour at Wax Park, which is next to the Moraine Recreation Center and Splash Moraine. The Saturday Wright Historical Tour will start at the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center, as it did last year. In conjunction with the Wright Historical Tour, Wheeler also plans to have a bike education program at Dayton recreation centers, and kids who pass the test will have a chance to ride the Wright Historical Tour with their parents. He's also hoping to have a ride for special needs kids as well; he would need people with tandems to volunteer bikes and captains for such a ride. During the Wright Wride, there will be a kids ride to SunWatch.

Hayward said Greg Brumitt of Five Rivers Outdoors called her, offering the DCC an informational table at Bike-to-Work Day on May 18 at the Second Street Market. A DCC volunteer would be needed at 6:30 a.m. to man that table; nobody present was able to volunteer. Brumitt also said volunteers are always appreciated to help out with the event.

In old business, Sally Pinnell asked how the Clair Duckham Birthday Ride went. Brown said it was a beautiful day and people rode at a very reasonable pace. Wert Minardi said Ben VanWye and Sheri Noer did an excellent job keeping riders together and stopping frequently to allow Duckham to get in and out of his daughter's car. Duckham rode a recumbent trike, although not very far. Wert Minardi said Duckham handled that bike with confidence and seemed less frail this year than last. Wheeler pointed out that former Gov. Bob Taft rode again this year, which is more than most politicians would do once they had left office.

In new business, Wert Minardi said the League of American Bicyclists is having Bike Ed 2007, a national conference on bicycle safety and education, June 14-16 in Austin, Texas.

Wheeler moved to adjourn the meeting, Sally Pinnell seconded, and the board unanimously agreed. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.

## Covered Bridge Tour successful despite financial loss

Seventy people came out in good weather to ride the Dayton Cycling Club's Covered Bridge Tour.

Because we had to order new patches, there was a substantial increase in event costs this year. Combined with insurance costs, this led to a significant financial loss (\$126.65).

However, we order patches only every five years or so and we have extra maps and registration forms, so next year's non-insurance costs should be less than \$50 (for paint and gas).

Over the next year or two (assuming good weather), we should more than compensate for the loss, with "operating in the black" realized for one or two years after that until new patches are again needed.

Since Mary and I operate this ride as a budget tour, our financial goal is only to break even.🚲

## With your help, a bike-ped bridge could connect Beaver creek, Fairborn

Many potential bicycle commuters in the Beaver creek area complain to me about the Fairfield Road Bridge. An alternative bridge may now be a possibility.

Roger Brislawn, chairman of the Beaver creek Bikeway Advisory Committee, needs your help to build a bicycle/pedestrian bridge across Interstate 675 west of the Fairfield Road Bridge. This bridge would connect Commons Boulevard in Beaver creek with Center Park Boulevard, which continues to Wright State University in Fairborn.

Brislawn asks our help in identifying our employers, in hopes of getting their help in supporting the bridge project. He must raise \$560,000 locally to qualify for a \$2.24 million federal grant.

The emphasis was on connecting “your neighborhood” to the existing trail network. The planners were interested in hearing ideas for locations of paths, routes and lanes, problems that have been encountered and possible solutions. Here are some of the things discussed:

• **Traffic lights and signage** where the recreation trails cross streets. On a number of trails there are often no “Bike Crossing” signs or flashing yellow lights.

• **Signage for a flood route on city streets**, perhaps from the Findlay Street Bridges past RiverScape MetroPark to Stewart Street. The Great Miami River floods the bikeways every spring and a permanent alternate route, especially for out-of-town bike tourists, is needed.

• **Location signage.** Street crossings and bridges could be labeled with the street name, to help trail users know where they are. This would be helpful during an emergency, since you could direct EMS or police close to where you are on the trails. Also, mileage signs are needed showing the distance to specific destinations.

• **Connecting existing trails.** A number of people feel that they have been promised connections of the Wolf Creek Trail, the Great Miami Recreation Trail into Tipp City and, especially, the Xenia-Jamestown Connector, but the completion dates



keep getting pushed back.

• **A western bike hub.** A number of Dayton Cycling Club members live west of Dayton. Myrna Hayward, our club’s vice president, suggested making Brookville a western bike-path hub, similar to Xenia. Trails could be constructed to connect to Eastwood

and Germantown MetroParks, and the Wolf Creek Trail could be extended from Verona to Greenville.

• **South connections.** My own pet project would be to create a bike lane from the Rubicon Trail, at Stewart Street, through the University of Dayton campus to Irving Avenue near Shafor Boulevard. From there a trail could be constructed using what is currently a storm sewer access “road” that runs along the Dayton-Oakwood border. This railroad grade route avoids the hills leading into Oakwood and, potentially, could extend to Dorothy Lane, connecting Kettering and Oakwood to the Great Miami Recreation Trail and the entire trail system.

If you are interested in chiming in, Alta Planning has a survey on its Web site <http://www.altaplanning.com/mvrpc/>. Informed input from local bicyclists will help in the design of an integrated Miami Valley trail system.🚲

## How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of

the ride are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.
