The Dayton Cycling Club Nominating Committee of Charlie Cretcher, Jim Foster and Mark Minardi (chosen because they live within a mile of each other) met Thursday, Oct. 18, to count the ballots and certify the election for the 2008 board of directors.

Fifty-two votes were received by the committee, of which 43 were ruled valid. The nine bad ballots were rejected and left unopened because the people who had submitted them failed to include some or all of the information required on the front of the envelopes.

The winners of the election are:

Vice president: Brenda Taulbee, 18 votes

Secretary: Brenda Taulbee, three votes

DCC Meeting Highlights

Sept. 5, 2007

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Wednesday, Sept. 5, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive, Vandalia. In attendance were directors Chris Brown, Bob and Marian Eley, Myrna Hayward, Harv Kiesel, Sally Pinnell, Michele Rizzardi, Ben VanWye, Kay Wert Minardi, Dwaine Wheeler and Tom Wilson. DCC members Patrick Murphy and Brenda Taulbee also attended.



President Ben VanWye called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

Secretary Kay Wert Minardi presented the minutes of the July meeting and for approval plus partial August minutes. Kiesel moved to accept the July minutes, Wheeler seconded and the board unanimously approved.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi gave her report. She said member Walter Burton had informed her that the Tipp City Mum Festival Ride has been canceled. This ride is usually covered by our insurance, so Rizzardi said she will inform the insurance company of the cancellation. She also said she had sent the appropriate insurance forms to John Horanyi so he can file a claim over the injuries he suffered on the newly painted stripes on the Little Miami Scenic Trail during a club ride on Aug. 19. Rizzardi reminded the board that DCC riders are covered on club rides. Wert Minardi moved to accept Rizzardi's report, Sally Pinnell seconded and the board unanimously concurred.

Patrick Murphy informed the board that he would like to revive the DayOx Ride in September 2008. He is willing to direct the ride, but said he needs advice and help to accomplish that. Wheeler said he has most of the information from when former member Steve O'Neill ran it, and he is willing to share it. The board expressed approval of the idea, and advised Murphy that a budget

will need to be submitted at the business meeting in December. Murphy was asked to keep the board informed.

Vice President Myrna Hayward said she enjoyed the Ladies Day Ride and has submitted an article about her ride with Lance Armstrong for publication in the November/December Spoke 'N' Link..

Membership Director Sally Pinnell said five or six new members joined during the Wright Wride, and praised Dwaine Wheeler for including that option on the Wright Wride registration form. New member Noreen Ondrusko sent a note along with her application stating her appreciation of several DCC members on the Across Ohio Bicycle Adventure (XOBA).

Pinnell added that 15 people came out for her Ladies Day Ride, including several who had never been on the ride before.

In her capacity as compiler of the touring miles, Pinnell expressed concerns about Fred's Ride. She said she is not receiving tour rosters regularly, and wonders if there is a DCC member physically showing up to lead the rides. The board discussed whether the ride should be listed in the S'n'L and on the website if no leader is

showing up. Directors see this situation as a liability, since for safety and insurance purposes, a DCC ride leader must be physically present at the rides. The board decided putting notifications to this effect in the S'n'L and on the website is called for. The board clarified:

- All riders — members and non-members — must sign the tour roster/waiver on club rides. Only DCC members who sign in are covered by club insurance, as the club pays an annual premium out of each member's dues for this coverage.

- A DCC member must serve as ride leader and be physically present on club rides.

- All riders — members and non-members — at invitational/special events are covered by club insurance. The club pays a one-time premium for every registered rider, taken out of the registration fee, at such events.

Speaking as newsletter editor, Wert Minardi said the ballot for the election of directors must be received by the membership by Oct. 1, so it is essential that people meet the Sept. 10 deadline for editorial copy and the Sept. 15 advertising deadline. She also reminded those running for office to submit their "Meet the Candidates" paragraphs and photos by Sept. 10.

Webmaster Harv Kiesel expressed concern that the ride list on the website doesn't match what's appearing in the S'n'L. He also is concerned that members aren't receiving the newsletter by the first of the month. He and Wert Minardi agreed to discuss this after the meeting.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown said picnic planning is going well. He has received leftovers from the Wright Wride such as frozen food and chips, and leftover soft drinks from the Old World Tour.

Touring Captain Tom Wilson praised member Eugena Ducker for filling in as leader on John Horanyi's Wednesday rides. Wilson is leading Horanyi's Sunday rides. Wilson feels that Horanyi will not be sidelined for long.

Huffman Spring Classic Co-Director Marian Eley suggested getting new magnetic signs for SAG drivers to put on their vehicles. She will get estimates on 18-by-24-inch signs in New Paris, and Kay said she would try to get estimates in Dayton.

Wright Wride Director Dwaine Wheeler reported that there were about 313 paid riders on the Wright Wride — about 204 of whom registered on the day of the ride. Five children rode for free. He said 26 people purchased jerseys, and he sold four Wright Wride cycle-tees from past tours for \$4 each. The Wright Historical Tour featured a long but very interesting tour of Hawthorn Hill by Steven Wright. About 25 paying riders rode that tour. With a few invoices/receipts still to come, Wheeler expects a net income of about \$2,800.

There were two injuries on the ride. One man broke his collarbone on a road that had a sign warning that the pavement ended ahead. Another woman fell and cut her ankle on her chainring. The injury wasn't serious, but it required attention in an emergency room.

There was a problem with road markings in several areas, stemming from the fact that the spray chalk Wheeler used was not as good as spray chalk used in the past. The chalk used in past years lasted through three or four rainstorms — approximately three months. This year the chalk was eradicated by only one storm.

Although Wheeler was able to repaint the roads around Farmersville the night before, he was unable to do so in Hueston Woods State Park. About 20 people turned the wrong way out of that food stop and got lost, but most of them rode fewer miles as a result. (Note: Farmersville and Hueston Woods do not allow permanent markings on their roads.)

Sally Pinnell mentioned that the shortest route was 33 hilly miles, and perhaps a shorter, easier route could be included. Wheeler responded that he has offered shorter, easier routes in the past and fewer than 10 people have chosen to ride them. He feels that the response doesn't warrant the effort expended. In addition, people riding such short routes would not have any food stops on their route. Marian Eley said the situation at this year's Huffman Spring Classic was similar.

In old business, Hayward reported for Beverly Owens that Brian Davis has agreed to emcee the DCC Banquet. Owens is still waiting for the Crowne Plaza Hotel's response about its availability for the banquet.

Sally Pinnell said Owens told her she had received

no responses to her article soliciting people for the clothing committee. Kiesel said Connie Weber told him she was interested, but he had not been able to pass the word to Owens yet.

Wert Minardi reported that Ed Witte had called her to say he is running for president. Taulbee said she plans on running for something, but she's not sure what office yet. There are no candidates declared for vice president and secretary.

Wert Minardi said Mark Minardi has volunteered to chair the committee that will count the ballots, and Barrie Bentley also said he will serve. Wert Minardi said they hope to find a third member.

In new business, Wheeler said Wert Minardi had suggested after the Wright Historical Tour that the club give donations to the Wright Family Foundation, Carillon Historical Park and the National Park Service for their support of the Wright Historical Tour. Steven Wright gave a wonderful tour of Hawthorn Hill, Dayton History didn't charge admission to Carillon Park and the National Park Service has been very supportive of our presence at the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center. Wert Minardi moved that the DCC donate \$100 each to the National Park Service, Dayton History and the Wright Family Foundation for their support of the Wright Historical Tour, to be counted as part of the Wright Wride expenses. Wheeler seconded the motion, and the board unanimously agreed.

VanWye said he had received an e-mail suggesting that the DCC invite Steven Wright to the DCC Banquet and present him with a Wright Wride jersey, all free of charge. The board agreed that this was a good idea. Wheeler said he could still order a jersey for Wright, and said he would do so.

At 7:32 p.m., Bob Eley moved to adjourn, Wheeler seconded, and the board unanimously agreed.🚲

Bikeway Mileage Report

Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

While I respect Ken as a journalist and a friend, I must clarify some comments in his column as follows:

- The League of American Bicyclists instructor who trained me in 2004 also trained DCC member Dan Carrigan in 2007. On both occasions, he said he has never seen a safe bike lane.

- The Ohio Bicycle Federation and I do not have disdain for bike lanes. In fact, we are always looking for safe ways to install them. I have offered assistance to the city of Dayton to find safe ways to install bike lanes.

- Cyclists have been killed using bike lanes. Deaths have resulted from "doorings," in which motorists parked at curbs next to bike lanes open their doors across the bike lanes as cyclists pass. I recommended to the city of Dayton's Engineering Department that it not run bike lanes along roadways where curb parking is permitted.

Philadelphia ride provides positive statement that cancer can be conquered

Since fellow Dayton Cycling Club member Bev Owens went to Philadelphia last year for Lance Armstrong's Livestrong Challenge and talked about what a positive experience it was, it didn't take long to invite myself when she decided to go again this year. I should add, especially when she said Lance would be there!

The idea is to raise money for the Lance Armstrong Foundation, so it costs \$50 to register and \$250 minimum to ride the tour. I don't like asking friends and family for money, and have stayed away from such events for this reason. After three months of deliberation, it came down to paying the money myself. I kept thinking, "With so many participants, there is little chance of seeing Lance Armstrong up close."

Sunday morning, Aug. 26, arrived and Bev and I were directed to our staging area. On a big screen we saw Lance as he greeted all of us. We then saw him ride off with the "fast" 100-milers. I was thinking, "Just like I thought: No close-up of Lance!"

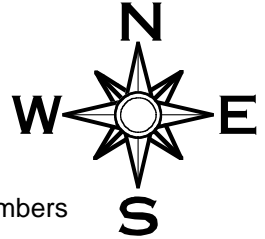
Our group finally got the green light to start, probably 20 minutes later. As we left the parking lot, we seemed to be climbing. Ten miles out, we hit our first rest stop in the hilly countryside northwest of Philly. The positive atmosphere was everywhere. There were cheerleaders encouraging riders as they came and went.

At about Mile 13, I had the experience of my life as Lance Armstrong rode by with two motorcycle police officers following him. He was already heading back. I'm not sure what part of the route he covered, but that image will stay in my mind forever.

The whole ride was a positive statement that cancer can be conquered. Riders wore signs saying, "I am a survivor," or in honor of a certain person. The Philadelphia event raised \$240 million that will fund programs and grants to help in the fight against cancer. Besides 1,780 bicyclists, there were 1,600 walkers and runners

and 400 volunteers united to show support for the more than 10 million Americans living with cancer.

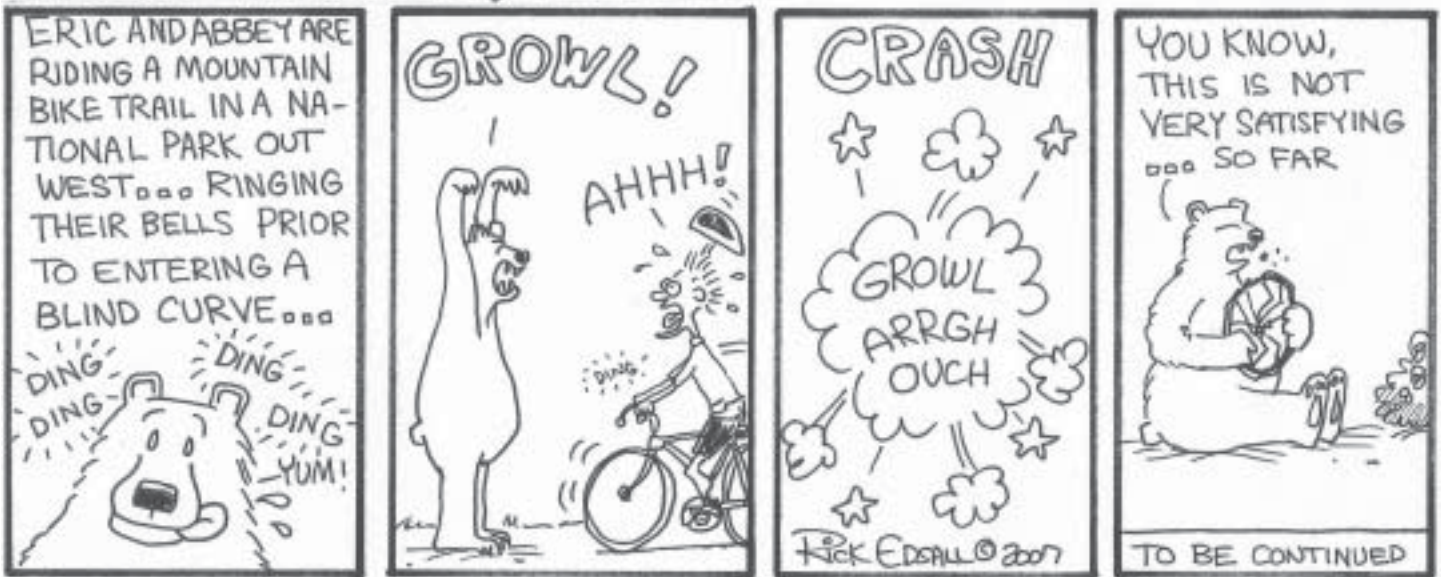

- All riders must sign the tour roster/waiver on club rides. Only DCC members who sign in are covered by club insurance, as the club pays an annual premium out of each member's dues for this coverage.
- A DCC member must serve as ride leader and be

physically present on club rides.

The next Spoke 'N' Link will be a combined January/February issue, so be sure to submit rides for both months plus the first week of March by Dec. 3. 

How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.

Wright Wride Weekend brings \$1,900 into DCC coffers

Thanks to terrific weather and wonderful volunteers, Wright Wride Weekend 2007 was a success.

About 25 people rode the Wright Historical Tour on Saturday, Aug. 25. The highlight of the ride was the lengthy, fascinating tour of Hawthorn Hill, the Oakwood mansion built by the Wright brothers after they made their fortune. Steven Wright, great-grandnephew of Wilbur and Orville, gave the tour. He peppered his talk with tales he heard from his father, who was a frequent guest at Hawthorn Hill. The riders also toured the Wright exhibits at Carillon Park and the National Park Service's Wright Cycle Co.

Sunday's Wright Wride began with 109 pre-registered riders, but registration volunteers Sally Pinnell, Joan Rudy, Valerie Van Griethuysen and Kim Wheeler were soon swamped. They ran out of day-of-ride registration forms as 204 people showed up wanting to ride.

Despite the crowd, nobody ran out of food or water and, as usual, a substantial food donation was given to St. Vincent's Hotel after the ride. In addition, non-perishable leftovers were used at the DCC Picnic a month later.

We apologize for the lack of road markings in Hueston Woods State Park. The spray chalk Wright Wride Director Dwaine Wheeler used in Hueston Woods and the Farmersville area was not as good as that used in the past (the old spray chalk is no longer available). The chalk previously used lasted through three or four rainstorms. This year the chalk was washed off by only one storm, which occurred just before the tour.

Although Wheeler was able to repaint the roads around Farmersville the night before the Wright Wride, he was unable to do so in Hueston Woods. About 20 people turned the wrong way out of that food stop and got lost, but most of them rode fewer miles as a result. (Note: State parks do not allow permanent markings on their roads, and organizers of the Tour d'Burg painted such large, intrusive arrows that Farmersville very nearly banned our marking the roads.)

Two accidents marred the tour. One man wiped out and broke his collarbone on a section of road that had

been washed out by the storm just before the tour. A sag driver took him back to Moraine, and the rider then went to the emergency room. In a separate incident, a woman


fell and cut her ankle on her chain ring. The injury wasn't serious, but the cut was deep enough that it needed attention, so an ambulance was called to take her to an emergency room.

Thanks to all of the volunteers who helped before and during Wright Wride Weekend 2008. Thanks also to ride sponsor Ray Lindemann Physical Therapy and K&G Bike Center, Xenia, which provided sag/mechanical support. Without them, putting on such an event would be impossible.
