

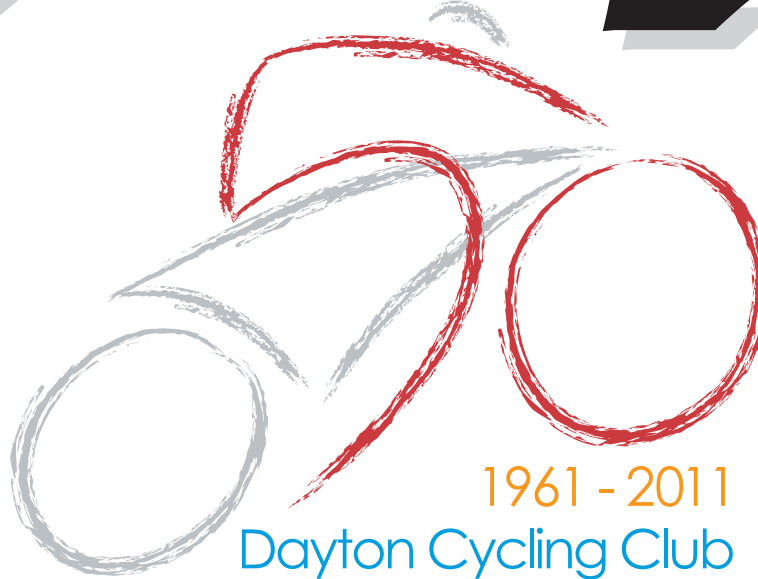

## Ride invitationals to have fun while supporting your club

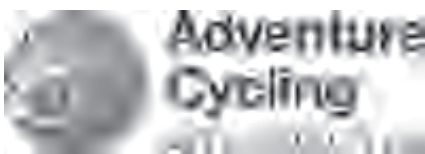

## It's just not my summer!

# DCC Meeting Minutes

**May 4, 2011**

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 4, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were board members Ed Witte, Brenda Taulbee, Michele Rizzardi, Bud Bell, Kathi Witte, Kay Wert Minardi, Chris Brown, Harv Kiesel and Chuck Smith. Club members Beverly Owens and Walter Burton also attended.

President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

Michele Rizzardi, treasurer, presented the financial report for April, saying there was nothing out of the ordinary. Wert Minardi moved that the board accept the treasurer's report as submitted, Smith seconded, and the board unanimously assented.

Brenda Taulbee, vice president, had nothing new to report.

Touring Captain Bud Bell had nothing to report. He asked how the special DCC sale event in April at Performance Bicycle went. Wert Minardi said she volunteered at the event and only one other DCC member attended. She did meet several customers who had just bought bikes or were shopping for bikes and were interested in the DCC. She gave them copies of the Spoke 'N' Link and showed them how to find club rides.

Wert Minardi said Performance is open to having such events for the DCC once a quarter or so. She suggested that perhaps Performance would schedule the next one on a Saturday, and we could schedule a club ride at Performance on the same day to bring out more members. Wert Minardi suggested that e-mail reminders be sent to members a day or two before events like this.

Kathi Witte, social director, had nothing to report.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi reminded the board that deadlines for the June newsletter were May 5 for editorial content and May 10 for ads.

Chris Brown, bikeways director, had nothing to report, as many of the area bikeways were under water

because of all the recent rainfall.

Webmaster Harv Kiesel reported that the web page is working without problems, and the club's Facebook page remains popular. A general discussion ensued during which it was agreed that we should make a greater effort to post reminders on that page a couple of days before events. It was suggested that such posts might prove more effective than e-mail blasts to dcc@topica.com.

Chuck Smith, advocacy director, reminded the board of the upcoming Bike Month events: Bike To Work Day at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base on May 18; Bike To Work Day in downtown Dayton on May 20; and the Miami Valley Cycling Summit at the Kroc Center in Dayton on May 20. He said DCC members Woody Ensor and Kay Wert Minardi will man the DCC booth at the summit.

Beverly Owens reported that the 50th-anniversary jerseys were supposed to arrive in early June, so the board needed to establish a price. It was agreed that the new jerseys would be sold for \$55 each, plus \$2.75 in postage. All previous club jersey prices were set to \$35 plus \$2.50 in postage. Wert Minardi will change the prices on the article in the newsletter. Owens also asked Wert Minardi to update her contact information in the "club apparel" article.

There was no new business, so Smith moved that the meeting adjourn and Brown seconded. Everyone concurred, and the meeting adjourned at 7:15 so the Huffman Spring Classic planning meeting could start.

Vice President Brenda Taulbee called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m.

Secretary Donna Williams-Powell presented the minutes from the April meeting. The minutes were reviewed and amended to include contact information for the Sept. 17 Air Force Marathon at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. Kiesel made a motion to approve the minutes as amended, Smith seconded the motion and the amended minutes were unanimously approved.

Wert Minardi, newsletter editor, presented the minutes for the May board meeting. Those minutes were revised to reflect the board members who moved for adjournment. Smith moved to approve the May minutes with noted additions, Taulbee seconded the motion, and the May minutes were unanimously accepted.

In addition, Wert Minardi reminded the board that the deadline for all submissions for the July newsletter is June 5.

Touring Captain Bud Bell had nothing to report.

Amy Jenkins, membership director, reported that the DCC membership as of May 23 consisted of 218 senior members, one junior member, 99 families with 195 senior and 26 junior members, and five honorary members for a total membership of 445.

Jenkins also said 30 hours of research has been completed relating to the mileage database and errors that occurred with some 2010 mileage awards. This information has been forwarded to Anita Patten so corrected

awards can be distributed.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown reported that work has begun on the Third Street Bridge in Dayton, but the Great Miami River Recreation Trail is expected to remain open on both sides of the river.


Harv Kiesel, webmaster, had nothing to report.

Advocacy Director Chuck Smith reported on the Bike to Work days held at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base and downtown Dayton in May. He also announced that the next Blue Streak Time Trial would occur on June 22 at WPAFB.

Smith also returned the donation that had been made by the DCC several years ago to save the Gem City Ice Cream Building. The effort to save the building, which once housed a bike shop owned by the Wright brothers, failed and the building is slated to be torn down by the city of Dayton.

Michele Rizzardi, treasurer, distributed the financial report for May and commented that there was nothing noteworthy in it. Wert Minardi moved that the board accept the treasurer's report as submitted, Powell seconded and the report was accepted without opposition.

Bev Owens brought the new 50<sup>th</sup>-anniversary jerseys to the meeting. The jerseys may be purchased for \$55 each, plus \$2.50 in postage if a jersey needs to be mailed.

There was no new business, so Smith moved for adjournment and Wert Minardi seconded the motion. Everyone concurred, and the meeting ended at 7:13 p.m.

## 1991 featured dedications, awards and memorials

In April 1991, the Dayton Cycling Club lost two beloved members: Hugo B. Daba and Paul Law.


Mr. Daba was a longtime DCC ride leader, so well known for his commitment to the quality of his Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday rides that the DCC created an award named in his honor. The Hugo B. Daba Award is presented annually to an outstanding ride leader who demonstrates Mr. Daba's qualities by: starting his or her rides on time; riding with the slowest riders; increasing DCC membership; assisting with bike maintenance as required; and assuring the safety of the group on the ride.

Paul C. Law had been chairman of the Miami Valley Regional Bicycle Council's (later Bike Miami Valley) Public Information Committee and had ridden almost 200,000 miles in 28 states over 50 years. The Paul Law Award for Bicycle Volunteerism had been created by the MVRBC in his honor and, after his death at age 73, the bike stairs leading up to Moraine from the Great Miami

River Recreation Trail were named for him.

Also in 1991, the opening ceremony for the Little Miami Scenic Trail, from Xenia to Yellow Springs, was scheduled for Sept. 13. And the bicycle sculpture "A Celebration of Bicycling," created by Jerome Meadows of Hyattsville, Md., was dedicated on July 18, near Carillon Historical Park.

The U.S. House of Representatives Public Works & Transportation Committee included \$5 million in the 1991 Surface Transportation Bill for what is now the Creekside Trail. The trail originally was called the H-Connector due to its connecting the Great Miami and Little Miami Trails and forming a rough "H" of trails. It is interesting to note that at the time, the trail was "officially labeled the 'Xenia-Dayton Connection.'"

This would be in keeping with the tradition that all trails in this area must be known by at least three names between their conception and completion (and sometimes beyond).

sent to his supporters:

“Some 15 years ago, I began gathering and assembling information about the bicycle trails of the Miami Valley. Since then, I’ve attended numerous bike planning meetings and more than a few trail dedications. I’ve made countless phone calls and e-mails to find out the status of a trail.

“I’ve met with many of you and with numerous local and regional planners in an attempt to keep you (and other bike riders) aware of the changing improvements, additions and changes to trail system. These efforts have led directly to the production of a monthly newsletter and to development of my steadily evolving website.

“At the time I began this task, I knew that eventually it would come to an end. Now is that time. Due to matters of ill health (and the advance of my disease) and also the unrelenting fatigue that accompanies it, I am no longer able to maintain the contacts or do the work required to continue either the newsletter or the website. Given this, it will probably come as no surprise to you that this is the last newsletter you will receive from me.

“And what about the website? I will continue to perform very minor updates, changes and maintenance work while negotiations are under way for transfer to another “owner.” If negotiations conclude successfully, the transition to a new webmaster and owner should proceed smoothly. If not, the webpage will simply atrophy until termination of its web-hosting contract.

“As you may already have assumed, I’ve worked long, hard and enthusiastically on this task. I leave it with deep regrets, but I simply am unable to do it anymore.

“Thanks to you all for your questions, input and support; I’ll miss you all.”

The only response I can come up with to this message is: No, Tom. Thank YOU!🚲

## Personal experience shows that secure parking is top concern for cycle commuters

Bicycle commuting surveys often find that the most important requirement for bicyclists to pedal to work is a safe place to park the bicycle while at work. The same should be true for errands.

Thursday, June 16, was a rainy afternoon. I pedaled along Kittridge Road through Huber Heights on my regular commute home to Vandalia from Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. It started to rain. I stopped at the Walgreens Pharmacy at the corner of Brandt Pike and Kittridge. There was no bicycle parking available. I left my Cannondale commuting bike against the outside wall of the building while I went inside to buy my dad a Father's Day card. When I emerged from the store with my card, my commuting bike was gone.

I immediately called the Huber Heights Police. They arrived and filed a report on the theft. That night, I called my insurance company. At this writing, two weeks after the event, it does not appear that I will get my bicycle back. My insurance company should reimburse me for my loss, minus the deductible for my homeowner's policy.

From now on, I will take my bicycle into businesses with me. If business management objects, I will go to other stores. We need to promote secure bicycle parking at businesses in our area. If there is no secure bicycle parking outdoors, enlightened business owners will permit us to enter with our bikes. The Walgreens where my bicycle was stolen has agreed to allow me to bring my bicycle inside.

I am interested in your views on this important issue of secure bicycle parking at businesses.

## 6-hour ride, time trials top MTB schedule

Hey, roadies, how about seeing how many laps you can ride in six hours on the John Bryan State Park trails in the Aug. 7 Race for Relief?

All laps between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. are counted as long as you start a lap by 3 p.m. Pre-registration on Speedy-Feet.com is \$30 per rider except for the family class, where the cost is a maximum of \$40 for up to four family participants with kids age 13 or less. We have categories of male and female solo; male/male, male/female and female/female duo teams; male and female single-speed and the family class. Day-of-ride registration is \$40 per rider, with a maximum of \$50 for the family class. Event sign-in begins at 8 a.m.

This is how the Miami Valley Mountain Bike Association (MVMBA) raises money for the portable toilet at the trailhead – hence the name Race for Relief. We'll have awards, a free lunch and a guaranteed good time.

## Race the clock on your mountain bike

Have you ever wanted to try a mountain bike race but were a little afraid of mass starts? Try a time trial!

The Fast Laps Off-Road Time Trial Series will be Aug. 17, 24 and 31, with a Sept. 7 rain date. Each time trial consists of a lap through the trails at John Bryan State Park. Riders go off every 20 to 30 seconds, and it is a race against the clock. Lap times vary depending on your experience but are typically around 45-50 minutes.

A full lap is about 9 miles, while kids and beginner women ride about 5 miles. Awards are given to the top finishers, and we have prizes and snacks at the last race.

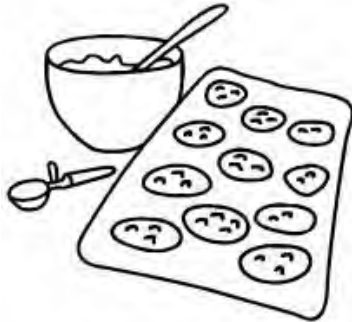
There are categories for everyone, and the \$5 donation helps fund trail and trailhead upkeep. The MVMBA and the Friends of John Bryan sponsor the time trials.

## How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.

### Class average speeds

Class	Average riding speed
D	9 to 12 mph
C	12 to 15 mph
B	15 to 18 mph
A	18 to 21 mph
A+	22+ mph
O	off road
TT	time trial

**Note:** Average riding speed is total distance divided by total riding time. Time stopped is not included.

### Defined areas

NE	North of U.S. 35 and east of I-75
NW	North of U.S. 35 and west of I-75
SE	South of U.S. 35 and east of I-75
SW	South of U.S. 35 and west of I-75

### Notes

Although this list is checked for errors, its accuracy is not guaranteed.

In the NOTES column, **CTC** means "call to confirm" and indicates that riders should call the leader prior to the ride to confirm that the ride will occur as scheduled.

In the LEADER, PHONE column, **LN** means a DCC member is needed to provide a tour roster at the ride listed. All area codes are 937 unless otherwise stated.

All Dayton Cycling Club rides are loops and return to the starting point unless otherwise noted. All rides are in Ohio, unless otherwise specified.

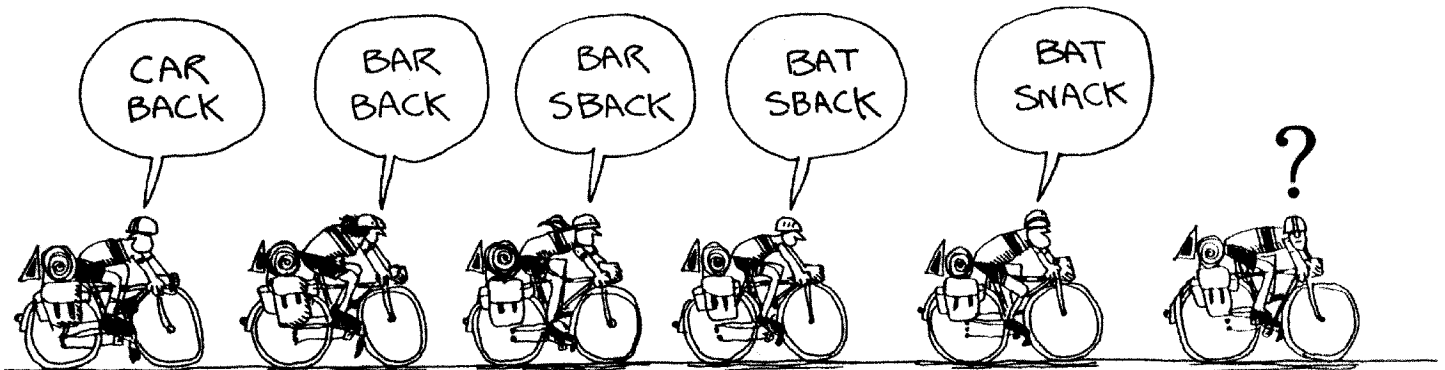
