# DCC Meeting Minutes

#### Feb. 1, 2012

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 1, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were board members Kathi Witte, Donna Williams-Powell, Bud Bell, Chris Brown, Chuck Smith, Kay Wert Minardi and Linda Tolly; and DCC member Mark Dues.

Social Director Kathi Witte, presiding over the meeting in President Ed Witte's absence, called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

Dues, who is a ranger at the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Park, presented an overview of the "Bike With a Ranger" bicycle tours and interpretive programs scheduled for 2012. He is working on a draft proposal for an aviation heritage bicycle trail and asked that the DCC support and advocate for this proposal. Since a quorum was not present, this item will be considered and voted on at the March meeting.

Next, the minutes from the January meeting were reviewed. Wert Minardi moved that the minutes be accepted with the addition of Smith and Rizzardi as attending and with the correction of Bell as the Wright Wride director. Bell seconded the motion, and the minutes from the January meeting were unanimously accepted.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi presented the financial report for January and noted that the cost for the club's event insurance has increased for 2012. Last year the cost was \$1.40 per rider, but it has increased to \$1.80 per rider. Rizzardi reported that the Ohio sales taxes have been paid. She has received a request to provide DCC support and insurance for the Mum Festival ride. In order for the DCC to provide insurance for a ride, the ride organizer must be a DCC member, the ride must be listed on the DCC website as a club ride and all participants must sign the DCC waiver.

Bud Bell, touring captain, reported that he is in the process of scheduling a touring meeting for all interested members.

Huffman Spring Classic Director Linda Tolly re-

ported on the progress of planning for the Huffman. The full-service ride will start at Golden Gate Park in Brookville, with a lunch stop at Filbrun's Pond in West Manchester. Tolly is seeking an increase in her budget for this invitational tour from \$450 to \$2,799. Smith made a motion to approve the increase, Bell seconded and the budget for the Huffman Spring Classic was increased without opposition.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi reported that the next issue of the Spoke 'N' Link will be the April issue. Wert Minardi also reported that the AAA is no longer presenting bike rodeos and the Oakwood Department of Leisure Services has asked if some DCC members would be willing to help with its community bicycling event by adjusting helmets, demonstrating bicycle safety and etiquette and escorting a short family ride. The event will be from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Saturday, April 28, with a rain date of Saturday, May 12.

Chuck Smith, advocacy director, reminded the board of the Adventure Summit at Wright State University on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 10-11. Volunteers are still needed to man the DCC display from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 4 to 5 p.m. Saturday.

Social Director Kathi Witte updated the board on preparations for the DCC awards banquet, which will be from 3 to 7 p.m. Sunday, April 22, at the Therapy Café.

Secretary Donna Williams-Powell had nothing new to report.

In old business, the board reviewed letters that will be sent to bicycle shops and police departments, offering free one-year memberships to the DCC for purchasers of new bikes and bike-patrol officers.

Powell moved to adjourn the meeting, Bell seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.

6:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 7, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were board members Ed Witte, Donna Williams-Powell, Brenda Taulbee, Kathi Witte, Chris Brown, Chuck Smith, Kay Wert Minardi, Michele Rizzardi, Harv Kiesel, Bud Bell and Linda Tolly; and DCC members Mike Williams and Clara Minardi.

President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m., and the meeting began with comments about club mileage calculations from member Mike Williams. Williams elucidated on his view that mileage tabulation is an integral and fundamental part of cycling and very important to members. The discussion ended with general agreement that a survey of club members would help the board determine the needs of riders and ways in which the board can more fully engage members in club activities.

The minutes from February's meeting were reviewed. Smith moved to approve the minutes, Wert Minardi seconded the motion, and the February minutes were approved.

Huffman Spring Classic Director Linda Tolly reported on planning for the Huffman Spring Classic. She has requested and received approval for a budget increase from \$450 to \$2,799 in order to once again make this a full-service ride. She has secured Golden Gate Park and Filbrun's Pond at reduced rates for the starting point and lunch stop, respectively. She has already received some sponsorship and continues to solicit sponsors/supporters and reduced fees.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi presented last month's financial report, noting that the Huffman Spring Classic budget has been adjusted as approved by the board in February. Powell moved to accept the report as presented and Smith seconded the motion. The financial report was accepted without opposition.

Advocacy Director Chuck Smith thanked everyone who volunteered at the Adventure Summit at Wright State University. He reported that the Ohio Bicycle Federation's Ohio Bicycle Events Calendar will be available soon and will be mailed to all DCC members and posted online.

Smith added that the first U.S. Air Force Blue Streak

Time Trial of 2012 will be April 11 at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. Anyone who wants to participate and is coming from outside the base needs to send an e-mail to Smith at Chuck@Ohiobike.org one week in advance of the time trial.

Taulbee, vice president, had nothing new to report. Chris Brown, bikeways director, reported that the Great Miami River bikeway segment skirting Kettering Fields will be closed for the next two years due to construction. On the plus side, construction on the bikeway segment from Eastwood MetroPark to the Kauffman Avenue/Wright Brothers Bikeway into Fairborn is scheduled to begin this summer.

Kay Wert Minardi, newsletter editor, reported that the deadline to submit editorial content for the April newsletter is March 7. The April edition will include applications for the annual DCC banquet, the Huffman Spring Classic and the DCC's GOBA sag service.

Ed Witte had nothing new to report.

Secretary Donna Williams-Powell had nothing new to report.

Kathi Witte, social director, reported that planning for the DCC banquet is nearly complete. The menu has been determined and will include vegetarian options. Brian Davis has confirmed that he will serve as the emcee and presenter for the banquet. Witte said she is planning a ride option before the banquet.

Touring Captain Bud Bell said he will hold a touring meeting at 3 p.m. March 24 at the Therapy Café. All current and prospective ride leaders are welcome to attend.

In old business, letters that will be given to purchasers of new bikes and members of bike patrols will be amended to specify that free memberships are not available to current members.

In new business, Wert Minardi announced that she and her husband, Mark, might not run the DCC sag service for next year's Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure.

Wert Minardi moved to adjourn the meeting, Smith seconded the motion. With there being no opposition, the meeting ended at 7:44 p.m. 350

This month the League of American Bicyclists' new Traffic Skills 101 course will be offered for the first time in the Miami Valley. The class will be held from at 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturdays, May 12 and 26, in the Wright Dunbar-Interpretive Center at 16 S. Williams St. (at West Third Street near downtown Dayton).

Participants will learn the skills necessary to ride a bicycle with confidence in traffic. They will gain a high degree of confidence and competence for pleasure, utility and sport riding under various conditions, mastering life-saving skills and maneuvers. The final exam will include a group ride through downtown Dayton.

Students will need a bicycle and helmet both Saturdays. Each student will receive a "Smart Cycling – Traffic Skills 101" textbook, the Ohio Department of Safety's

Return to a time when bicycles were new, cars were few and these covered bridges were in their youth. The youngest covered bridges on this ride are more than 100 years old! For almost 30 years this ride has been celebrating their heyday.

#### This is a budget tour. For a small fee we provide the basics only!


**START:** 8 a.m. at the Brookville High School parking lot, Brookville, OH. **Registration is from 7 to 8 a.m. We may be gone riding already if you arrive later! No restrooms or water are available at the start.** Fast-food restaurants, gas stations, an America's Best Value Inn (937-833-4003) and a Holiday Inn Express (937-833-9998) are near the highway exit. A KOA campground (800-562-3317) is about 5 miles from the start.

**ROUTES:** 23 miles (two covered bridges), 45 miles (five covered bridges), 74 miles (seven covered bridges), 105 miles (10 covered bridges). Rolling to hilly terrain. Route direction arrows are painted on the roads at intersections.

**FACILITIES:** No food or drinks are provided. All routes pass through small towns where water, restrooms, snack foods, etc., are available at "quickmarts" and restaurants. Bring money or your own food. No sag service will be provided, so bring a pump and patch kit and tools and know how to use them. Be prepared for the weather.

COST: \$5 per person (thanks to increased insurance costs), which pays for the route marking and a route map. A commemorative ride patch will be available for an additional \$1.

# There is <u>no</u> pre-ride registration. Sign up the day of the ride. All riders must sign a DCC ride release form.

#### Advocates still pushing for bike/pedestrian bridge over I-675

Efforts to have a bicycle/pedestrian bridge constructed over Interstate 675 continued in February and March.

The idea for a bridge crossing the highway near Sam's Club on New Germany-Trebein Road and the Holiday Inn on Presidential Drive has been around for several years. Discussions continue with the cities of Beavercreek and Fairborn and with Wright State University.

Currently, the only roads in the area that cross I-675 are Grange Hall Road and North Fairfield Road, neither of which is particularly safe for bicyclists or pedestrians seeking access to the Mall at Fairfield Commons or the WSU campus.

Having commuted by bike to work in Fairborn, I have ridden the Fairfield Road bridge and know it is not the most comfortable place to be on a bicycle. A dedicated bridge would be nice and would offer safer access from the Wright Brothers/Kauffman Avenue Bikeway to Beavercreek's "A" bike route, leading to the Creekside Trail at Grange Hall Road.

When the Mad River Trail extension to Kauffman Avenue is completed, the bridge could provide the final connection to a loop route, on both streets and bikeways, with access to Eastwood and Huffman MetroParks and gates to Wright-Patterson Air Force Base on Springfield Street.

#### In 2003, MVPs helped GOATS who needed boats

The summer of 2002 was pretty uneventful for the new MetroParks Volunteer Program. We were under the auspices of the MetroParks rangers, but they weren't sure what to do with us. Several MVPs volunteered to help at MetroParks events such as RiverBlast, where we got to know many of the rangers and show what we were

capable of doing.

I once had the opportunity to "guard" a parking lot and am proud to say it was still there when my shift ended! It turned out that my job had been to ensure that no unauthorized people parked there.

2003 was the year we had the opportunity apply some of the training we had received, as well as to learn valuable lessons. That was the year the Greater Ohio Area Tandem Society (GOATS) hosted the Midwest Tandem Rally in Dayton. Steve Knick, who at the time was the MVP coordinator, happened to meet a few GOATS near Miamisburg, heard about the rally and offered the MVPs as guides, SAG support, etc.

The rally was held on Labor Day weekend and, of course, it rained like crazy Friday night. On Saturday morning, MVPs escorted the tandems from the Crowne Plaza Hotel to the Great Miami River Recreation Trail, then waited for them to return via the Mad River Trail that afternoon. During that time, all of Friday's rainwater slowly flowed into the Mad River. By the time returning riders started showing up, the bike path had flooded at Keowee Street.

Steve and I were at RiverScape, guiding tandems up the switchback to Monument Avenue, when some riders told us about the flooding. We rode down and found that people had begun pushing their tandems partway up the levee and were crossing the flooded area.

It looked very dangerous and we got on the radio, asking other MVPs to join us and help lead riders back to Findlay Street, take them along Monument Avenue and back to the hotel. Meanwhile, Steve and I started helping the riders already on the levee to get their tandems across.

It was only a few minutes, but as more tandem rid-

ers showed up, they also started pushing their bikes up and across the levee. Many did not want to backtrack when they were so close to finishing the ride for the day, and things quickly got out of control. One man, with a quintuple, pushed his bike up and across rather than wait and take a safer way.

Finally the other MVPs showed up and escorted riders back up the Mad River Trail, stopping other tandem riders they met and guiding them back to Findlay Street. Steve and I joined them after we got the last riders who wanted to cross the flooded area. We then deployed along Monument, guiding the tandems along our makeshift detour.

The whole situation had been extremely hazardous. We never should have allowed riders to keep trying to cross along the levee. In discussing it later, we realized we could apply what we had learned from working with the rangers; we had the authority and responsibility to tell people what they should and should not be doing. A bad experience ultimately made us better, more effective bike patrollers.

On Sunday morning I was again to meet up with Steve, this time along Marina Drive in West Carrollton. 2003 was the year of the microburst, and the strong, windy storms had been knocking down trees and limbs along the bike paths all summer. I had taken to carrying a fold-up saw in my panniers and, sure enough, came across a large branch that had fallen across the trail. I stopped, sawed off several parts until I could pull the branch off the path, then continued on my way. I met Steve with wet sawdust all over my radio harness, in my helmet, on my shoulders, etc. He said, "What happened to you?!" and I told him about the tree branch. Since then Steve has referred to me as "Woodchuck."

In September 2003, Steve received a letter from Art Fabian, GOATS treasurer, thanking the MVPs for their help. Many of the tandem riders had been concerned about riding on the bike paths and were pleased to find that they were wider and better maintained than in other parts of the country. Fabian also mentioned that by the time the he heard about the path flooding at Keowee Street, the MVPs had already set up a detour. It was nice hearing that our efforts were appreciated and knowing

that we would be even better at our next event.

The GOATS will be hosting another Midwest Tandem Rally in our area next year. The event will be based at the Holiday Inn in Beavercreek on Labor Day weekend 2013.

#### DCC member and friends riding to Alaska to fight diabetes

Ken Mercurio, a Dayton Cycling Club member from Monroe, is training for a 4,200-mile bike tour from Butte, Mont., to Alaska and halfway back to Butte. A group of five riders will depart Butte on June 15, and plan to return by Aug. 8. They will use a motor home as their sag wagon, taking turns driving about 20 miles each day and riding the remaining daily average of 60 miles.

The cyclists are calling their ride Five For Alaska, and are raising funds for the American Diabetes Association. They hope to raise \$30,000 to combat the disease. The riders are linked to the American Diabetes Association's Tour de Cure, and each has his own webpage to seek donations. Bob Brown, who has had this ride as a longtime dream, planned the route. Mercurio and Brown worked together at Carnation Co./Nestle Foods. Brown rounded up his son and the other three team members to make a five-man peloton.

The five men will cross the Continental Divide three times. They will see Banff, Dawson Creek, Whitehorse, Anchorage, Seward, Denali National Park, Fairbanks and many moose and bears along the way. They anticipate fighting mostly hungry mosquitoes.





#### How to get ready for spring mountain biking

Ahhh, warm weather is upon us, and it's a perfect time to hit the trails and have some fun with that mountain bike. What do you need to do when you dust off that bike?

First, pump up the tires and check to make sure they hold air. If not, you may need some new tubes. If you have tubeless tires, you will want to make sure the tires are OK.

So, how do you know if tires are OK? Tires are just fine if they have decent tread and no cracking in the sidewalls. Otherwise, you risk having a flat just when you don't need one.

Next, you want to check to make sure the brakes and gears are working OK. If not, it may be time for a tune-up. Or, if you are mechanically inclined, maybe you can change your own brake pads, chain, cassette, chain rings or cables. Don't forget that plenty of bike shops offer training sessions that teach simple maintenance, and a few do-it-yourself jobs pay for the class.

The one thing people often forget is that your drive train needs lubrication. So get out a rag, spray some lube on it and wipe down that dirty chain until it becomes clean. That's a simple way to lube your drive train and clean the gunk off your chain at the same time. It will also save your drive train from premature wear.

So far, we have been fortunate this spring. Last year we had the wettest spring in more than 10 years and there wasn't much trail riding until July. This year it has been dry and the tread is perfect for biking. So get out there and enjoy but remember that if it rains a lot, chances are that the trails may need a little time to dry out. The general rule is that the trails need one day to dry out for every inch of rain we get.

Above all, be sure to walk your bike through muddy areas where your tires might leave a rut. All areas on a trail don't dry out at the same rate, so you might start out on dry conditions but run into low-lying areas that hold water and drain poorly. We all love to ride, but remember that volunteers build and maintain most trails. Your help in keeping the trails in primo condition helps us all!

To check conditions at MoMBA (MetroParks Moun-

# Touring Talk

#### Keep safety first on club rides

On March 24, Dayton Cycling Club members gathered for some socializing, good food and a discussion of some bicycling issues at the annual touring captain's meeting.

Sally Pinnell of the mileage team reviewed the procedure for submitting tour rosters. We then discussed ride leaders' responsibilities, including riding with slower members, using cue sheets and distributing the ride leader's cell phone number to fellow riders.

I noted each rider's responsibility for choosing the correct ride and for being on time.

A suggestion was made that ride leaders listing a ride as, say, 40+ miles to extend that range no more than 6 or 8 additional miles. This would give riders a general idea of the total distance of a given ride.

We reviewed biking equipment, including tires, brakes, drive train and a properly fitting helmet. These same items are also safety issues that should not be neglected. While going downhill at 40 mph is not the time to discover that your bike has worn tires or faulty brakes and that your only recourse is to start praying that your

helmet fits like a fine Italian glove.

Bob Pinnell has put together a complete bicycle maintenance manual. This PDF can be found if you google "Bob Pinnell bike maintenance," or you can send me an e-mail request for a copy of the PDF.

Like automobile accidents, bicycling accidents are going to occur. As responsible riders, we want to minimize such incidents to all riders. Please be very attentive when riding a bicycle. Be sure to follow the rules of the road and announce your intentions. And please, don't talk on a cell phone while riding!

The bottom line I try to stress is to be very methodical and predictable when riding in a group.

Here are some rules to remember while riding on the bike trails:

- Share the trail with other users.
- Bikers yield to ALL other users.
- Keep right except to pass.
- Announce passing to others.
- Move off the paved trail when stopped.
- Obey all rules and regulations.

#### How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.
