June 6, 2012

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 6, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were board members Ed Witte, Kathi Witte, Brenda Taulbee, Kay Wert Minardi, Bud Bell, Linda Tolly, Chuck Smith, Michele Rizzardi and Chris Brown. Member Phil Hinrichs also attended.



President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Paul Coudron, executive director of the Life Resource Centre, announced that the TK Hausfield Ride for Life would be held on July 28. Coudron gave board members ride brochures, and the board agreed to place brochures in the Spoke 'N' Link.

JoAnne Denland from the Arts and Beautification Department of Huber Heights is promoting "Star Spangled Heights" and invited DCC members to ride in the parade that will be held at 10 a.m. June 30. Denland said DCC members would be a welcome addition to the parade and could register online until June 15.

Phil Hinrichs, a DCC member who was active with Bike Miami Valley when that entity still existed, spoke about signage for low-traffic streets paralleling Dayton's arterial roadways so bicyclists would not need to ride on busy streets. He is trying to persuade city officials of the value of this approach and sought support from the DCC as the project progresses. The board agreed to support his efforts. He said he is also addressing the need to make the final connection of the Wolf Creek Rail-Trail between Trotwood and downtown Dayton. He will keep the board apprised of his progress in these efforts.

Michele Rizzardi, treasurer, presented the financial report for May, noting that there was nothing remarkable in it. Wert Minardi moved to accept the financial report as presented, Smith seconded the motion and the

May financial report was accepted without opposition. p.m.

Huffman Spring Classic Director Linda Tolly reported that the ride was a success and indicated her willingness to chair the ride again in 2013.

Bud Bell, touring captain and Wright Wride director, pointed out that the DCC missed a good self-promotion opportunity this year and suggested that the club investigate setting up a booth for downtown Dayton's 2013 Bike to Work Day in order to promote DCC membership. He also stated that a planning meeting for the Wright Wride would be held at 7 p.m. Thursday, June 14, at Marion's Piazza on North Dixie Drive in Dayton.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown was asked by Wert Minardi whom to contact about overgrowth on the Creekside Trail, and he suggested contacting the Greene County Parks and Recreation Department or Five Rivers MetroParks to address this issue.

Kay Wert Minardi, newsletter editor, said items for the July newsletter should have been received already. She also reported that there were 10 openings remaining on the DCC's GOBA sag truck. She said a new sag driver will need to be recruited for 2013 since Mark Minardi will no longer be able to it.

Social Director Kathi Witte reported that she still has some helmets available for distribution to children.

Chuck Smith, advocacy director, reported that the next U.S. Air Force Blue Streak Time Trial would be held June 13 at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. Send an e-mail to Smith if you plan to ride so he can get your name on the list for entry to the base. Smith also said he will be teaching League of American Bicyclists traffic safety classes on Sept. 8 and 22 and Oct. 7 and 21. Contact Smith if you are interested in attending. Smith also said Wright State University will offer a cycling class during the 2013 spring semester, which he will teach.

Wert Minardi suggested that the DCC donate part of the bequest from longtime DCC member Jim Perry to the Adventure Cycling Association's U.S. Bicycle Route System project. Smith moved to donate \$1,000 to the project in memory of Perry. Wert Minardi seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved.

Smith moved to adjourn, and Bell seconded the motion. With no opposition, the meeting ended at 7:35

Bikeways and Beyond

Don't limit yourself to riding only on bikeways or only on streets

Several years ago a friend of mine moved to the West Coast. One of his first observations was, "People in Oregon drive like idiots." A few years later he came back to Dayton for a visit and said to me, "What happened? People here drive like idiots!"

We decided that people everywhere drive "like idiots," but each region in its own peculiar way. Once you learn and mimic the idiosyncrasies where you are, traffic becomes more predictable and safer.

This also applies to bicycling on the streets versus bikeways. Those who bike the streets see the bikeways as full of danger, from dogs on leashes to kids on bikes, in-line skaters and the narrowness of the paths themselves. Bikeway cyclists fear cars, trucks and buses, especially those that are turning right at intersections.

The reality is that both locations can be safe or dangerous, depending on the experience of the cyclist. As someone who rides both, I encourage all bicyclists to learn the skills necessary for riding streets and paths.

The best advice for road cycling is to be assertive and take possession of the street you are on. This does not mean being *aggressive*; instead, move away from the curb and into the lane more, allowing automobile drivers to see you and causing them to give you a wider berth when passing. Of course, you also should be courteous: If a car is coming toward you while another is behind you and it is safe to do so, you can move smoothly and predictably toward the curb, allowing the car behind you more space to pass.

On a road with two lanes going in the same direction, it is best to "take" the entire right lane. Bus drivers, especially, like to be in the right lane and will pass you with an absolute minimum of clearance unless they are "forced" into the left lane. Interestingly, once drivers see that they have to get in the left lane to pass, they move completely into it ... usually.

On bikeways the general rules are to slow down and look ahead. Bikeway riding is more about the ride than the destination, so there is no reason to try to achieve your personal best time, especially when you see an obstacle ahead. For whatever reason, children on bikes heading toward you invariably start heading directly *at* you, veering across the path like slow-motion, bike-seeking missiles.

There is nothing wrong with passing a kid on a bike, or someone walking their dog, while riding at 5 mph or so. Also, saying "on your left," should be done loudly, well back from someone who is in front of you. Saying "on your left" when you are right next to someone startles them, and they will turn suddenly in your direction — i.e., right in front of your bike.

Try riding in the location you're not used to, build your skills and let streets *and* bike paths be your routes to being a better cyclist. 🚲

How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.

Class average speeds

I prepared many batches of Wright Wride Salad before the ride and mixed it at the lunch stop. (My husband, Mark, helped chop onions and may still be crying.)

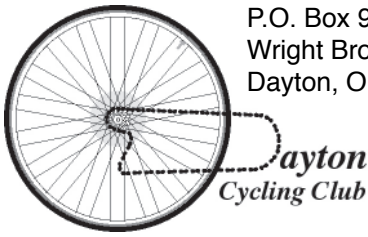
Joan Caldwell, Mary Lemaster, Sally Pinnell and Joan Rudy again coolly handled the chaos of day-of-ride check-in and registration.
