The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Wednesday, Oct. 3, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive, Vandalia. In attendance were directors Chris Brown, Bob and Marian Eley, Myrna Hayward, Harv Kiesel, Sally Pinnell, Michele Rizzardi, Ben VanWye, Kay Wert Minardi, Dwaine Wheeler and Tom Wilson. DCC members Beverly Owens and Bob Pinnell also attended.



Member Chuck Smith dropped by before the meeting to remind the board that he and fellow DCC member and LAB instructor Dan Carrigan would be teaching a Street Smarts course Saturdays, Oct. 6 and 13, at the Yellow Springs Library.

Since President Ben VanWye was late, Vice President Myrna Hayward called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

During her report, Treasurer Michele Rizzardi said the Wright Wride netted \$746.48, and jersey sales netted \$1,200. She also said there is \$1,195.89 in the Jo Glover fund. Wert Minardi moved to accept Rizzardi's report, Kiesel seconded, and the board unanimously approved.

Membership Director Sally Pinnell reported that 31 new members joined between Aug. 1 and Oct. 3. As of Sept. 30, there were 315 family members belonging to 128 families, 313 adult members, six honorary members and one junior member, for a total of 635. She asked if anyone has a recent address for Janelle Parks Graham. Her newsletter was returned as undeliverable.

Pinnell also said she had an e-mail from American Specialty Insurance and Risk Services requesting verification of the membership status of John Horanyi and Brian Hall. Apparently they have made claims for inju-

ries suffered during a DCC ride.

Pinnell praised Chris Brown for a wonderful job planning and running the DCC Picnic.

Finally, Pinnell expressed concern about Fred's Ride, since nobody seems to be leading it. She gets e-mail mileage submissions from various people who ride it, but no tour rosters.

Secretary Kay Wert Minardi distributed minutes from the August and September meetings. Harv Kiesel moved to accept the August minutes, Tom Wilson seconded and the board unanimously agreed. Sally Pinnell pointed out that the name of Noreen Ondrusko was misspelled in the September minutes. Marian Eley moved to accept the minutes as amended, Bob Eley seconded and the board unanimously concurred.

Wert Minardi also stated that when she asked Brenda Taulbee if she was submitting a candidate statement, Taulbee said she was running for vice president on a write-in basis.

As newsletter editor, Wert Minardi pointed out that the next newsletter would be a combined November/December issue. Editorial copy was due Oct. 10, and advertising was due Oct. 15.

Webmaster Harv Kiesel said the DCC website was updated. VanWye asked him about a message Kiesel had sent containing sample DCC business cards. Kiesel explained that this was suggested by member Bob Young, for distribution to people who might be interested in the club, and Young wanted to be sure the board agreed with the wording. The cards contain basic information about the club that is also on the website, and it is on a one-sheet file that anybody interested can print for themselves. The board had no problems with this method of promoting the DCC.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown said the Sept. 22 DCC Picnic went well, and 20 to 22 people attended. He thanked Sally and Bob Pinnell for their help, particularly with the qualifying rides. Two people rode the 50-mile qualifier. Brown said he had alerted Five Rivers MetroParks Bike for the Health of It leaders that others would be using the bikeways, and that group riders should ride single file.

But one of the Bike for the Health of It riders rode

directly at Anita Patten when she was riding to the picnic, leaving her nowhere to go. She was driven off the bikeway, and suffered a scraped elbow.

Brown said member Joe Casto reported that where repaving was done along the bikeway from the K Station to Crain's Run, large cracks have developed. Brown said the cracks had been outlined in orange paint, so most likely work on the cracks would be done in the near future. Casto also suggested that a park bench be placed at the end of the path for people to rest on before they turn around, but board members said it would be wise to find out first when the bikeway will be extended before any request for benches be made.

Brown also pointed out that several comments about cycling had appeared recently on the Dayton Daily News opinion pages. One person claimed he had never seen a bicyclist obey a stop sign, leading to the comment that perhaps he had seen only three bicyclists. Another person said bicyclists should be required to get vehicle licenses and pay a road-use tax in order to ride on public roads. Board members said they don't personally know any cyclist who doesn't also own and drive a car. The letters and speak up comments were deemed not worth responding to.

Brown also reported seeing an article about Oxford installing bike lanes.

Touring Captain Tom Wilson said he went to Fred's Ride a couple of times. He said he spoke with Frank Cooley and Kevin Dobo, and they said no ride leader is showing up at every ride. There is, however, a crowd that regularly rides, and a mailbox has been installed just for DCC tour rosters. In its discussion of this matter, the board agreed that all of the people who lead, even on an alternating basis, should be included in the ride list in the newsletter.

Huffman Spring Classic Co-Director Marian Eley said she had gotten quotes on magnetic SAG signs. Her quote from a business in New Paris stated that two 12-by-24-inch, two-color, 30-mm magnetic signs would cost \$65; and two 18-by-24 signs would cost \$75. A place in Greenville charges \$100 for two 18-by-24 signs and \$125

for two 24-inch square signs. Wert Minardi got quotes from Creative Banners (two 12-by-24 for \$95) and Sign Connection (two 18-by-24 for \$96) for single-color signs with printing but no logos. Wert Minardi moved that the club purchase six 18-by-24-inch signs for \$75 per pair. Dwaine Wheeler seconded, and the board unanimously approved. The board specified that the signs should say "Dayton Cycling Club SAG" and be white with dark print.

Rizzardi prefaced Wright Wride Director Dwaine Wheeler's report to say the Wright Wride plus shirt sales netted \$1,911.59. She said the payment of the state sales tax on the shirt sales will not significantly change that figure. Wheeler said he plans to have the 2008 Wright Wride website up by Jan. 1.

Social Director Beverly Owens announced that the DCC Banquet will be from 5:30 to 10 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 23, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Dayton. We need 20 percent down to hold the reservation, plus \$500 to rent the room, and the remainder 72 hours before the banquet. The board decided to again pay half the banquet fee for DCC volunteers.

VanWye said Anita Patten had said last year that she would continue to arrange the awards. Owens said she would contact Patten to confirm that.

Kiesel asked Wert Minardi to submit an article about the awards the DCC gives for inclusion on the website, and the board asked that it be published in the next newsletter.

In old business, Owens reported that she contacted the makers of the club jerseys about the possibility of changing their colors. There is no extra charge if the graphics remain the same. It was decided to present the color options to the membership on the website in addition to in the newsletter. Wheeler said he could print 700 copies of the paper version at home within 20 minutes.

It was suggested that we discount the few remaining jerseys, offer some as door prizes at the banquet and perhaps even offer them as part of packages we have offered for the annual Great TV Auction held by Channels 14 and 16.


It was determined to sell the jerseys at the upcoming

Five Rivers Outdoors GearFest for \$35 to DCC members. For \$55, non-members can purchase a jersey and get a membership as well.

In new business, Tom Wilson volunteered to represent the DCC at GearFest, from 10 to 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 6.

Brown reported that a Major Taylor Cycling Club may be forming in Dayton.

Wert Minardi said she would not be at the November meeting, but she will ask Brenda Taulbee to fill in as secretary.

Owens moved to adjourn the meeting, Kiesel seconded, and the board unanimously voted to adjourn at 7:27 p.m.

Year (male and female), Ride Leader of the Year, Volunteer of the Year, Jo Glover Award (outstanding woman 55 or better) and anything else you think merits recognition. If you know people who were ill or injured enough that they had to stop bicycling, but since have returned to riding, please let us know so we can give them Courage awards. Contact any board member with this information.

Directors of events should submit the names of all of their volunteers so those people can qualify for their half-price banquet discount and receive a plaque or bar.

It is up to individuals to report to Patten by Jan. 5 any indoor mileage recorded on trainers or rollers during January, February and December.

In addition, it is up to individuals to see that their final 2007 mileage totals are in to the bikeway, commuter and touring mileage compilers by Jan. 5. Those people's names and contact information are available elsewhere in this newsletter.

We enjoy recognizing children who have tallied 100 miles or more, but our database doesn't distinguish between adults and children. Parents of children younger than 18 should report their children's miles. Any miles the kids pedal, whether on their own bikes or on the back of a tandem or add-a-bike, qualify.

OBF seeks to improve Ohio law

The Ohio Bicycle Federation's "Better Ohio Bicycling Bill #2," House Bill 390, was referred to the Ohio House Committee on Infrastructure, Homeland Security, and Veterans Affairs on Dec. 4.

The two most important improvements in H.B. 390 are a requirement that passing motorists leave a safety margin of at least 3 feet from a bicyclist and the elimination of the current Ohio Revised Code requirement that bicyclists ride "as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable." 🚲

Bikeway Mileage Report

Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

DCC commuters top record in only 11 months

I am happy to report that Dayton Cycling Club commuters have ridden 77,611 miles through November. This breaks by 2,217 miles our record of 75,394, which was set only last year.

It is no coincidence that our commuting miles have soared along with gasoline prices. Twenty miles per bowl of oatmeal certainly beats \$3 per gallon of gasoline!

Try LED headlamps

The short daylight hours of winter force us at times to ride in darkness. When I pedal in the dark to DCC board meetings, I am often asked about my lights.

I used an incandescent headlamp for many years. The old incandescent required a heavy battery pack that I had to recharge each night for my next one-hour pre-dawn commute to work.

Today I have four very light LED headlamps on my handlebars and a small one on my front fork. They each provide me up to 90 hours in power from four AA batteries, and up to 1,500 candlepower of light. The result is a better view of the road and less weight on my bike.

Prices have gone down on the LED headlamps as their technology has improved. If you have not used LED headlamps, I suggest giving them a try.

For years, I have used amber LED lights in the rear, one blinking and one constantly on. The blinking amber light catches the eye of motorists far behind me. As motorists approach, the constantly-on amber light tells the motorist exactly where I am.

Paris-Brest-Paris 2007: A wet American in Paris

In the 2006 narratives on my fight against age and the boredom of riding to Young's Jersey Dairy every week, I wrote about riding RAIN, four brevets and the 1,200-kilometer Boston-Montreal-Boston (BMB) randonnée. At that time I alluded to the chance that I might ride Paris-Brest-Paris (PBP) in 2007.

Well, in early 2007 I kind of made up my mind and by late spring was pretty sure. In August, with my money already sent and reservations made, I decided there really was no way I could not go. To miss PBP would be to pass up an opportunity that might not occur again. PBP happens only every four years and is distance cycling's premier event.

In preparation for PBP I rode in Florida, Massachusetts, North Carolina, Kentucky, New York and Ohio; climbed well over 120,000 feet, was soaked a number of times by rain and snow; was blown about by winds of more than 20 mph; and faced temperatures in the 90s for days on end. I rode four 200k brevets, three 300k, two 400k, a 600k and a 645k over very challenging terrain. I was ready for PBP — or was I?

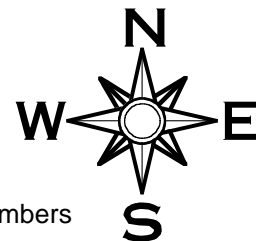
I traveled to Paris several days before the event and ended up taking the train from the airport to the start in Saint-Quentin-en-Yvelines. The train station was several terminals away, so I had to haul a suitcase, backpack and a bicycle case about half a mile to find it. Once on the train, it was detoured, which meant I had to haul my suitcase, backpack and bicycle case up and down three stories of stairs to a second and then a third train to get back to my original train. On the positive side, I was helped by a number of Parisians who insisted on carrying my bike case.

After getting to my hotel, I set up my bike and went for a ride though the southern suburbs. I was amazed at how many people I met out riding that I knew or had seen at other rides. I ended up hanging around with several BMB friends — one from Nova Scotia, another an Irishman living in Scotland — as well as many American friends.

During the next few days I rode with Japanese, Scots, Canadians, Americans and people of a number of other

nationalities. If no one was around my hotel, I would hop on my bike, ride into town and bump into someone I knew. I toured Versailles by bike and went out into the countryside through small French hamlets. It was really cool; however, so was the weather and getting worse.

At 8 p.m. Aug. 20, I was among a group of 500 — out of about 5,150 total riders — to start PBP. My group had only 80 hours to finish, while the others would start at 10 p.m. (90 hours) and 5 a.m. (84 hours) the next morning.

It was the most awesome event to be involved in, with amazing banners and pageantry. As we lined up there were thousands of people to see us off, and we would see enthusiastic crowds at many of the places we would visit in the next few days.

The first 75 miles of PBP were the most fun yet nerve-wracking I have ever experienced, with our group of 500 staying in a peloton behind a pace vehicle. Speeds ranged from 18 to 28 mph as we flew through cities, towns, villages and the countryside. It was like being in the Tour de France, with most of us being pulled along by the group and at times hanging on for dear life. At the start I had met two friends, Brice (Quadzilla) and Scott (BMB), and was able to work with them for the first part. However, darkness, weather, crashes and the number of riders eventually split us up.

At around the 75-mile point, the leaders of our group hit a steep hill and decided it was time to separate the wheat from the chaff and they were gone. The next time I would see them, they would be more than 100 miles ahead of me and going in the opposite direction.

And then God sent the rains. Well, that's what it felt like, as the sky opened up and the rain did not fully stop until after PBP was over. The temperature stayed in the

low to mid-50s and the wind at 10 to 20 mph for most of the ride.

I was riding through the night without a light in sight and the original group shattered, but was able to regroup with several Europeans. Even though I could not communicate with them, anybody to ride with was a pleasure given the conditions. We rode together into the second checkpoint in Fougères, where some stopped for a shower and others for a full meal. The older French riders likely stopped for wine, a beer and a cigarette.

The next morning brought me to the third checkpoint at Tinteniac, which is where the mind games began for me. I was cold, wet and fighting stomach problems. I had to keep reminding myself that I was riding a bicycle in the French countryside, which was stunningly beautiful, and seeing things I had never seen before and might never see again. I was riding through walled towns that were built more than 400 years ago, past farmers

who were moving their cattle out to pasture, and through lands that had seen the action of two world wars.

By the fourth checkpoint in Loudeac there was a torrential downpour and I was close to hypothermic. The thought that kept me going? "I can never show my face again at a club ride if I don't finish this." Then along came Scott and Brice, I changed into some dry clothes, readjusted my mind and off we went.

We rode together to the next checkpoint at Carhaix, where there was a support vehicle with dry clothes. I bought a new pair of arm warmers from a vendor, ate and convinced a mechanic to lube my now-cruddy chain.

I stayed with Scott and Brice all the way to Brest, where I stopped for a three-hour sleep while they pressed on. I knew I needed a break from the weather and had already decided to ride more conservatively than I had the BMB. After the rest I started to feel better, with the exception of my stomach. (I attributed this pain to being neurotic and decided to live with it.)

This day I would go through four checkpoints, see some of the countryside I missed behind the downpours, learn that German and Dutch riders speak English better than many Americans, and have some wonderful experiences with the French people. I had hit the turnaround and was passing people still on their way out. I could tell people's starting times by their numbers and thus knew how much time they had left to finish. I saw people who started with me who were 150 miles behind me and knew they were not going to make it. Others in later groups were more than 200 miles behind and going only about 10 mph, which made me feel sad for them.

As my second full day ended, the heavy rains came again and I needed to get out of it or melt like the wicked witch. So I stopped in Villaines-la-Juhel at about midnight for three hours of sleep. When I awoke it was still raining, just not as hard. My final leg was easy; I knew that all I had left was about 250 kilometers, which I would have no trouble with.

As I was riding through the night I kept my course by following the taillights of other riders. At one point I thought I was moving pretty fast, but when I checked my speed it was only 13 mph. I went through the next checkpoint at Mortagne-au-Perche as dawn approached and started to pick up speed as the sky actually bright-

ened to just cloudy with drizzle.

The last checkpoint at Dreux was about 100 kilometers from Paris. I was on the home stretch. For part of this section I rode with a friend Todd, from Cincinnati, but he hopped on a faster group and went ahead.

I rode the last few miles with a German, swapping stories of our glory. Prior finishers, riders' families, locals and organizers formed a cheering section at the finish to welcome riders home, which was wonderful.


It had been a very long, wet, cold and tiring ride, as well as being one of the most fulfilling events of my life. The people were great, the scenery beautiful and the event amazing. I had not finished in the time I had wanted, but given the conditions I was satisfied. The weather was the worst in at least 50 years of the PBP, so my time of 66 hours and 46 minutes was respectable. I finished 411th out of 5,150 starters and 16th out of more than 600 Americans. More than a quarter of the riders had dropped out of the event and another group had been given additional time to finish.

PBP is big in France and really big in Brittany. How big? Well, there are banners announcing the event all

over. People set up kiosks to support the riders in small villages. In the middle of the night, in the rain and in the middle of nowhere, families would be standing on the side of the road cheering us with "Bon courage," "Bon route" or "Allez!" All I could think was, "Thanks, but why aren't you home in bed?"


As we rode to the finish, people stopped on the side of the road and cheered us as we passed. I was treated to wonderful locals who did everything in their power to help me.

When it was over and I had taken a long soak in a French tub (there was no shower), I started to think, "What's next?"

In the fall of 2007 I rode four more brevets in three different states and started planning future rides. I am looking at possible 1,200-kilometer rides in Bulgaria or the Shenandoah Valley in 2008 and London-Edinburgh-London (1,400k) in 2009. Although I enjoyed PBP, I don't know if I will go back in 2011. I seem to have a hard time committing to such things. ... Just look at my decision-making last spring.
