Duckham rode all 17 miles in the stoker position on an Opus Counterpoint tandem. On the Counterpoint, the stoker and captain have separate drive trains. Thus, Duckham had the option of pedaling or not. He was encouraged not to pedal, but he insisted on pedaling all the way from Vandalia to Troy.

DCC Meeting Highlights

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 2, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were directors Chris Brown, Marian and Bob Eley, Harv Kiesel, Beverly Owens, Sally Pinnell, Michele Rizzardi, Kay Wert Minardi, Tom Wilson and Ed Witte. Members Myrna Hayward, Thomas Hoffmann, Anita Patten, Bob Pinnell, Roger Rizzardi, Chuck Smith and Dale Williamson also attended.



President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi had previously e-mailed the board the minutes of the February meeting. Wilson moved to accept the minutes as presented, Kiesel seconded and the board unanimously concurred.

Witte said he was proud and inspired to be a DCC member, in light of the initiative recently taken by a number of members:

- Chuck Smith and Dan Carrigan have scheduled a League of American Bicyclists Road I course at the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center.

- Bud Bell is running a self-contained bike-camping trip to Indian Lake State Park in June, and is leading Fred's Ride on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

- Valerie Paoloemilio is starting a weekly slow ride out of Tipp City.

- Thomas Hoffmann is starting a Christian ride within the DCC.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi warned during her report that when she started as treasurer, the club had more than \$40,000 in assets, but that amount has fallen to \$29,000. Discussion of ways to increase our income was postponed to the "old business" portion of the agenda.

Wilson moved to accept the treasurer's report, Owens seconded, and the board unanimously approved it.

Chuck Smith told the board that the Ohio Bicycle Federation's Bicycle Events Calendar is out, and will be seen by at least 25,000 Ohio bicyclists.

Touring Captain Tom Wilson asked if there is a special way that he should list overnight rides. He was told to list such rides according to the starting point, just like other rides. Wert Minardi said she clarifies in the Notes column of the ride list, putting the dates of overnight and multi-day tours. Kiesel said out-of-area rides are listed only on the web site, in order to save space in the newsletter and, therefore, postage.

Several members expressed concern about listings of out-of-state or overseas rides. Patten pointed out that this issue has arisen many times over the years. Everything depends on intent. If several DCC members plan to go on an organized tour out of state, there is no problem listing it so the riders receive credit for club miles.

Huffman Spring Classic Co-Director Marian Eley announced that there are now five sponsors of the Huffman, although the total amount given is a little less than it was last year. T-shirts have been ordered, and every rider will receive a magnet as a free gift. Eley will man a table at Dayton's May 16 Bike to Work Day, in an effort to attract more Huffman riders.

Eley asked for the board's opinion on whether, if a century route to the Bicycle Museum of America were planned for the Huffman's 35th anniversary next year, riders would tour the museum. Normally the museum isn't open on Sundays, but it would open for the Huffman if enough people would stop to tour it. The consensus was that there are few people who ride the century, and many if not most probably would not take the time to stop and tour the museum. Some alternative starting points were suggested, in order to route more people to the museum. Smith said the museum has a traveling display that Eley might be able to have at the 2009 Huffman.

In response to a question from Michele Rizzardi, Eley said the new SAG vehicle magnets are in and will be used during the Huffman Spring Classic.

Membership Director Sally Pinnell said 25 new members joined from Feb. 26 to April 1. Club member-

ship as of April 1 consists of 282 family members in 119 families; 297 adults; 1 junior and six honorary members, for a total of 586 members. Thirty-seven memberships expired on March 30, so the member number was likely to rise in the next few weeks.

Pinnell added that club patches are nearly gone, so she has ordered new ones that will substitute the Ohio Bicycle Federation for the U.S. Cycling Federation.

Pinnell announced that 23 members have elected not to receive hard copies of the Spoke 'N' Link. Of those, 10 are new members. She said we need the application on the back of the S'n'L updated to reflect that option in addition to the new dues rate, if approved. Wert Minardi asked Pinnell to e-mail an electronic version of the updated membership form so she can use it in the newsletter without retyping it. Kiesel offered to send the Word format of the page for the Pinnells.

Social Director Bev Owens said the new club jerseys are due to arrive in mid- to late April. The old price was \$55, but shipping costs have gone up. It was agreed that we should sell the new jerseys for \$60, plus shipping and handling.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown had nothing to report other than that the waters were receding.

Witte said he understands the frequent rain has led to some erosion problems along the bikeways.

In old business, the board and visitors discussed the issue of increasing annual dues.

Kiesel presented this brief analysis of the financial

He pointed out that even with the \$5 dues increase, we would not wipe out the budget deficit.

Sally Pinnell said she had received two e-mail messages. One suggested that people who wish to receive a paper copy of the Spoke 'N' Link be charged for it. The other said to eliminate the paper version of the S'n'L and require members to download their newsletters.

Bob Pinnell said the 2008 budget deficit is not a simple matter. The shortfall is about \$9,500. A \$5 dues increase would make up only \$2,100. If one-third of the members would elect to download the newsletter rather than receive paper copies, we would save an additional \$4,600. If we also made the banquet break even, we would nearly make up the deficit. He pointed out that these numbers assume that all of our invitationals break even. Bad weather can sink such events.

It was pointed out that not every member of the club has Internet access. In addition, our postage rates would go up substantially if we mail fewer than 200 newsletters. In that case we would have to send the newsletters by first-class mail instead of standard (bulk-rate) mail.

DCC member Thomas Hoffmann suggested that we cut back on the annual awards and issue the newsletter quarterly instead of 10 times a year. Patten pointed out that awards help motivate members to ride and volunteer, so cutting them might ultimately hurt the club. The idea of a quarterly publication was somewhat intriguing, but Wert Minardi and Wilson foresaw serious deadline problems because of the extensive lead time a quarterly publication requires.

Marian Eley said she belongs to an organization that has a quarterly newsletter, and the news is often old.

DCC member Roger Rizzardi suggested possibly


going into business running bicycle events such as the Troy Strawberry Festival tour or the Tipp City tour. Patten pointed out that nobody in the DCC would step forward to take over when Calvin's Challenge directors retired. Also, she said festivals often are not interested in giving up the money they make by running their own bike tours.

Patten said we might not have the luxury of subsidizing the banquet for volunteers anymore. This led to a discussion of increasing banquet costs and how we might reduce them. Hoffmann said he would look into other banquet options and report back to the board.

The board thanked everyone for their comments and said it will continue its cost-cutting efforts. Directors pointed out that most items have increased in price since the last dues increase 11 years ago, particularly postage and gasoline. The board and the adult members present unanimously approved the \$5 cross-the-board dues increase, to take effect on May 1.

In new business, Hoffmann complained about the \$25 day-of-ride registration fee for the Huffman Spring Classic and Wright Wride. Marian Eley said that although her day-of fee was increased \$5, she also has increased her club-member discount to \$4. Patten pointed out that she has attended single-day tours in other states that were substantially more expensive. Among them were an \$85 tour in Arizona and a \$45 one in Oregon.

Sally Pinnell said she had received Senior Olympic information in the mail, if anybody is interested.

Wert Minardi moved to adjourn the meeting, Michele Rizzardi seconded, and the board unanimously concurred. The meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

Bridge work presents obstacles for bikeway riders

As of this writing, the Monument Street Bridge over the Great Miami River is halfway down and work is under way on widening Interstate 75. As I-75 crosses over the Great Miami River Recreation Trail three times, this effectively closes the path between Stewart and Helena streets.

At this point there is a marked detour from Riverside Drive, up from behind Temple Israel. The crushed limestone path on top of the levee on the west bank leads cyclists along Riverview Avenue to the bike stairs at Sunrise Park, along Edwin C. Moses Boulevard. Be careful when crossing Main Street: You need to go right at Main, to the crosswalk, then cross to Riverview.

The Stewart Street Bridge is scheduled to begin coming down this month. At that point, cyclists will need to stay on Edwin C. Moses Boulevard past Sunrise Park, and ride over the Washington Street Bridge to Vietnam Veterans Parkway on the east bank of the river. I believe you will be able to cross Stewart Street normally, continuing to Carillon Historical Park and beyond.

Little Miami Trail getting needed repairs

DCC member Bob Young has been reminding Ohio State Park officials of problems along the Little Miami Scenic Trail south of Xenia. He recently received the following note from Alan Ferguson, park manager of the state parks in our area:

“We have just confirmed that we have secured the funding for pavement repairs to the area just south of Morrow on the Little Miami Scenic Trail. We will be resurfacing the section damaged by tree roots south of the village, repairing the pavement over the culvert replacement at South Lebanon, and resurfacing a bridge near said culvert. The affected area is roughly between mile markers 28.3 and 34.2.

“Visitors to the trail can expect closures in the area

from May 27 through mid-June. We would appreciate any help you can give us in getting the word out.

“After this project, we hope to turn our attention to the surfacing on the three bridges up north near Hedges Road. We have applied for fiscal year 2009 funds for those (FY 09 begins next month). ...”

At-risk youths benefit from Building Bridges program


I recently had an opportunity to participate in a biathlon with youths from the Montgomery County Juvenile Court’s Building Bridges program. The DCC has facilitated Building Bridges receiving an \$18,000 grant from the Greater Ohio Area Tandem Society (GOATS). GOATS had disbanded but still retained some funds, which its members wanted to donate to a worthwhile cause. As one of many projects Building Bridges, which receives unclaimed bicycles from area police departments, will train kids in bicycle mechanics and repair. Those who pass the course will receive bicycles.

The biathlon was a chance for these young people to get out and get some exercise. It consisted of a two-person team, one of whom would run (or walk) 3.4 miles, then tag the second person, who would bike for 10.2 miles, riding the same loop three times. I attended with former DCC president Anita Patten and was teamed with two kids, both of whom biked, while I was relegated to the walking portion. How did that happen? Oh, yeah — we were encouraging the kids to ride bikes!


After our walking, Anita and I could not resist getting our bikes out and riding the 10.2 miles anyway. Then, being adults, we had to ride the loop a couple more times,

IMBA formed when representatives of five California mountain-bike groups concerned about the closure of trails to cyclists met in March 1988. Today IMBA has members in all 50 United States and 40 other countries. 

Bikeway Mileage Report

Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

Insurance help available for injured riders

Part of the funds collected annually by the Dayton Cycling Club are used to purchase liability insurance. The insurance policy is specifically designed for bicycle clubs by the League of American Bicyclists and is administered by American Specialty Insurance & Risk Services Inc.

All members who sign tour rosters at advertised DCC rides are covered by accident insurance paid for by part of their annual membership fee. Note that non-members also must sign tour rosters but are not covered by the club's insurance.

At the DCC's invitational rides (Huffman Spring Classic, Wright Wride, etc.), all riders — whether they are members or not — are covered by accident insurance paid for with part of the ride registration fee.

Duckham was quite modest about his accomplishments in the interviews. He attributed his long life to good cardiovascular activities such as cycling and race walking.

Former Ohio Gov. Bob Taft, who now teaches at the University of Dayton, participated in the event for the seventh time. Taft's great-grandfather, William Howard Taft, became president in 1908, when Duckham was almost 2 years old.

After Duckham blew out his birthday candles, he pledged to return in 2009 for his 103rd birthday.

The DCC has celebrated each Duckham birthday since his 90th in 1996 with a similar massive celebration following a ride to the Troy Frisch's Big Boy. The event has become a family reunion, with Duckham children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren participating. The family and a large contingent of DCC members fill the restaurant to overflowing each year.

breakfast rides Duckham and his group of "Gray Wolves" enjoyed for many years.

In 1961, Duckham and fellow bicycle racer David Ashmun asked Huff Corp. CEO Horace M. Huffman Jr. to sponsor their attempt to break the cross-country tandem bicycle speed record. Huffman, who was not interested in the record, proposed that they create a bicycling

club, which became the Dayton Cycling Club. The DCC, originally a racing club of 25 members, has grown to about 700 cyclists and holds bicycle rides almost every day of the year.

How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.

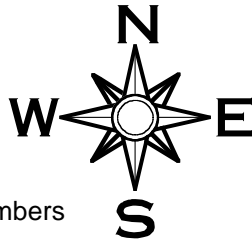
