# DCC Meeting Minutes

The Dayton Cycling Club 2008 Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 7, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were directors Chris Brown, Marian and Bob Eley, Harv Kiesel, Beverly Owens, Sally Pinnell, Michele Rizzardi, Brenda Taulbee, Kay Wert Minardi, Dwaine Wheeler and Ed Witte. Members Dan Carrigan, Myrna Hayward, Anita Patten, Bob Pinnell, Roger Rizzardi, Chuck Smith and Dale Williamson also attended. Guests Jack Bernstein and Ron Reigelsperger attended at the invitation of Patten.



President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

DCC member and League of American Bicyclists instructor Dan Carrigan explained that he and Chuck Smith will be teaching more road biking classes, and wish to get the word out to DCC members. He asked if they might advertise their classes for free in the Spoke 'N' Link in return for offering a discount of approximately \$8 to DCC members who take the class. Wert Minardi moved that this arrangement be established, Owens seconded, and the motion received unanimous approval.

Jack Bernstein of the now-defunct Greater Ohio Area Tandem Society (GOATS) and Ron Reigelsperger of the Montgomery County Courts thanked the DCC — in particular Anita Patten — for facilitating a grant awarded by GOATS to the Building Bridges program to establish a bike-repair operation. At-risk youths in the court system will be taught how to repair bicycles donated by police from unclaimed-property rooms. The bicycles would then be donated to needy children. Once youths complete the bike-repair course and work for some time at the job, they can qualify for a new bicycle for them-

selves. The goal is to give the young people marketable skills and the discipline to apply them, while doing good for others.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi distributed the minutes of the March 5 minutes for review. Patten pointed out that she had agreed to serve as an adviser to Wings Over the Rainbow if they would call her regarding their stated goal of running a bicycle poker run fundraiser. Wert Minardi moved that the board accept the

minutes as amended, Brown seconded, and the board unanimously agreed.

Witte announced that member Bud Bell had undergone triple bypass surgery on May 5 at Dayton Heart Hospital. Roger Rizzardi added that Bell was fortunate in that no lasting damage was done to his heart, but he will be recuperating for a while. He will not be leading an overnight bike-camping tour in early June as he had hoped to.

Witte added that he would attend the May 8 LAB Bicycle Friendly Communities Workshop sponsored by the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission.

Vice President Brenda Taulbee had nothing to report.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi said auditors are still needed. Patten volunteered to head the audit of the 2007 books. There was nothing unusual in the treasurer's report, and Kiesel moved to accept it as submitted. Wheeler seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

Huffman Spring Classic Co-Director Marian Eley said 100 riders had pre-registered for the May 18 event. She added that a volunteer meeting on May 5 was well attended, and it looked like there would be enough volunteers at the ride.

Wright Wride Director Dwaine Wheeler said he had sent 1,000 fliers to the Cincinnati Cycle Club for inclusion in their June newsletters. He also is advertising with the Central Indiana Bicycling Association. He passed around a letter from the Farmersville/Jackson Twp. Commission imposing strictures including the use of spray chalk for road marking and stating that the club may be charged if any police or emergency personnel must respond during the tour for any reason. This skittishness seems to stem from Tour d'Burg's past use of excessive and excessively large road markings in the area as well as one commissioner's antipathy toward bicyclists. Wheeler said he might route the tour around Farmersville and not use its park as a rest stop.

Member Chuck Smith said good weather graced the Clair Duckham Birthday Ride. Duckham rode the entire 17-mile distance from the Vandalia Rec Center to the Troy Frisch's Big Boy — one day before his 102<sup>nd</sup> birthday. Smith also reminded the board that Wright-Patterson


Air Force Base will celebrate Bike to Work Day on May 9, and downtown Dayton will do the same on May 16.

Membership Director Sally Pinnell said 10 new members joined from April 2 to May 7. Club membership as of May 7 consists of 263 family members in 113 families; 292 adults; 1 junior and six honorary members, for a total of 562 members. She added that about 60 people whose membership expired in April have not renewed. She suggested that we have a grace period on the increased dues, and it was agreed to extend that period to June 1. New patches have been ordered and should arrive soon. Pinnell said she will update touring mileage on the website every couple of weeks, so people can check their progress.

Social Director Beverly Owens had new club jerseys available for sale. They are \$60, plus postage and handling.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi announced the June newsletter deadlines: May 10 for editorial material and May 15 for paid advertising and lists. She said 59 people are registered for the DCC GOBA sag, with 14 still coming. Registration will close soon.

In old business, Witte announced that two people — Linda Tolly and new member Donna Williams-Powell — had volunteered to serve as secretary. Since Tolly is a ride leader and has volunteered extensively in the past, Witte will offer the position to Williams-Powell and ask her to attend the June 4 business meeting.

Michele Rizzardi moved to adjourn the meeting, Wert Minardi seconded, and the board unanimously concurred. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

Clara, rode a little bit of the tour with me. It was only about 56 miles, but I thoroughly enjoyed them. Clara was a good riding partner who was willing to put in some real effort to push our tandem over the hills.

Third, we had terrific sag help:

- I am so thankful that my husband, Mark, is happy to drive the Dayton Cycling Club's GOBA sag truck and lead the effort to buy drinks, ice and food each day. As always, he made a demanding job look easy.

- DCC member Bob Tackett was a wonderful deputy, making morning coffee for those who enjoy it, buying necessary supplies for the group and transporting people too ill to bike or ride the jouncing truck to the next town.

- Melisa and Mark Vojtko of Mantua, Ohio, were most gracious in making it possible for Clara to ride part of GOBA. The Vojtkos would put my single bike on their trailer and then drive to the a.m. food stop or the lunch stop and wait for us slowpokes to arrive. There they would help me swap the tandem for my single bike, wait for Clara and me to eat, then take Clara to our overnight camp to reunite with Mark. The Vojtkos also transported some ill members of our party.

- The GOBA sag coordinator rescued Clara and me on Friday. Just 3 miles out of Coshocton on an uphill, I noticed that the sidewall of our front tire was fraying. I immediately stopped. We ended up waiting more than an hour before somebody showed up. Once he arrived, however, the man with the call letters KC8HOP was all business, and soon we were on our way to our rendezvous with the Vojtkos.

Fourth, the Amish and "English" communities of Millersburg joined forces to put on a fabulous lunch. The Amish brought propane-fired ovens to the park and baked fry pies and other delectable goodies. The peanut butter and jelly sandwiches were on homemade bread. One could buy containers piled high with fresh, juicy fruit or homemade trail bologna and chunks of various cheeses. Finally, dessert was ice cream churned by a) a draft horse named Max who walked in a circle to turn a chain attached to a big ice cream freezer, or b) a steam engine hooked up to two more ice cream freezers. # Bikeways and Beyond

## Don't let trail closures keep you off your bike


Trail repairs and road construction along area bikeways continue to be the order of the day in mid-June.

South of Rice Field in Miamisburg, the Miami Conservancy District is overseeing the construction of a new section of trail. A piece of the riverbank where the trail currently sits has eroded away, taking the trail's foundation with it. The new section is being placed a few hundred yards away from the Great Miami River.

In Greene County, the Ohio-to-Erie Trail east of Xenia was to be closed for a couple of days to repair damage to a culvert west of North Bickett Road. The heavy rains in early June might have delayed that work, but it should be completed by the time you read this.

Rather than looking at these closings and detours as a negative thing, why not take the opportunity to ex-

plore different routes and types of riding? Riding on bikeways requires different skills, techniques and etiquette than riding on city streets. If you have been comfortable only riding the paths, now is an excellent time to expand your cycling universe. Learning to make eye contact with motorists, use hand signals regularly and "take the lane" on a four-lane street can be added to bikeway wisdom such as, "watch out for kids on bikes" and "slow down near people walking dogs" to make you a safe, strong, well-rounded cyclist.

And, until all of our bike paths are completely connected, confidence in riding on the street can get you from one trail to another, increasing your bikeway mileage. Remember, as long as at least 50 percent of your ride is on bike paths, your entire ride can qualify as DCC bikeway miles.

**‘Czar’ surprises himself in competition**

Former DCC member Charlie Czarniecki on June 22 sent an e-mail stating, in part:

“I wasn’t able to train or even ride my bicycle much this year. So I went off to this year’s Rocky Mountain Senior Games this weekend hardly expecting to win a ribbon. I didn’t even bring a camera.

“I came home with a second-place finish in the 12-mile road race, third in the 24-mile road race and two thirds, in the 3- and 6-mile time trials. That means I qualified to attend my second Senior Olympics, which will be in the San Francisco area next summer.

“The second-place finish qualifies me to do both road races. The thirds in the time trials mean I might be invited to do them, too, if the state’s first- and second-place finishers don’t sign up early to attend.”



**Bikeway Mileage Report**

**Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.**

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

I first met Rick Edsall when he called me in 1993, offering to draw cartoons for the Spoke 'N' Link. I had been the DCC newsletter editor for less than a year, and I was desperate for some content to lighten up the S'n'L.

Rick was a former bicycle racer who worked at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. Although I eventually found out law was his vocation, it was quickly evident that he was passionate about his avocation, cartooning. He drew for every issue of the S'n'L from the start.

His first cartoon appeared in the August 1993 newsletter. Rick provided "Far Side"-like cartoons, topical and seasonal cartoons, cover art for the DCC Banquet programs and art for the club T-shirt.

I looked forward to our monthly chats. Over the years I learned that Rick was an Army and Air Force veteran and that in addition to cycling, he loved his family, cartooning for law journals and designing his own annual humorous Christmas cards.

When I decided to run for president of the DCC, Rick agreed to run for secretary and served for two years. I appreciated his presence on the board. His background as a racer and lawyer served the DCC well.

Rick was supportive when Mark and I decided to adopt. He helped us by notarizing a bunch of documents. Once Clara came into our lives, he always asked about her and delighted in seeing her when he came over with his cartoons. We were touched when he drew a cartoon based on the true story of Clara's first bike ride.

When first diagnosed with multiple myeloma in 1995, Rick was given months to live. He concentrated on the living part of that diagnosis, and spent a lot of time with his family — especially his grandchildren.

Through all the ups and downs of his 13-year battle with cancer, Rick remained upbeat.

We had an understanding: As long as Rick felt well enough to draw, there would always be room for his cartoons in the Spoke 'N' Link. Sometimes a few months would go by with no cartoons, but then the drought would end for a while. I suspect that cartooning became a form of therapy, especially after Rick took a medical retirement from the WPAFB law offices.

In May Rick called to tell me he had to take a sabbatical from cartooning, as he had just been diagnosed with leukemia. But even then he was upbeat.

Therefore, it shocked me when his wife, Patty, called me the day after his death. I don't know how ill Rick was when he called, but he had me convinced that his absence would be a temporary thing.

I will miss Rick's sense of humor and his cartoons. Even more, I will remember him for his love of family and country, and his optimism in the face of a deadly disease.🚲

## How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.
