

## **Minutes of the June 1, 2016, Dayton Cycling Club Business Meeting**

**June 1, 2016**

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 1, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were board members Bud Bell, Jim Morgan, Donna Powell, Chuck Smith, Kay Wert Minardi and Ed Witte; and DCC members Kathi Witte and Bob Hartman.

President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and began the meeting with a review of the Wright Wride planning meeting on May 25<sup>th</sup>. He said there are three volunteers for registration, but volunteers are still needed to work at the food stops. Donna Powell will coordinate food and Dwaine Wheeler has volunteered to mark the route. Brett Holland will work on laying out this year's route. Tentatively, the ride will begin at Twin Towers Area Park, and the Lodge at Clifton Reserve will be used for the lunch stop. Witte said the next Wright Wride planning meeting was set for 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 29, at Panera Bread, 1203 Brown St., Dayton.

Donna Powell, secretary, presented the minutes from the May meeting. Chuck Smith moved to accept the minutes as written, Bud Bell seconded the motion and the May meeting minutes were approved.

Vice President and Advocacy Director Chuck Smith gave an update on House Bill 154 and Senate Bill 192. The bill has passed the Ohio House, but the House and Senate are recessed until after the November elections. If the bill does not pass in the Ohio Senate before the end of the year, the process will have to be started again. Smith urges all cyclists to continue to contact their state senators to express support of this bill.

Smith also reported that the Downtown Dayton Bike to Work Day was very successful this year, with more than 700 people turning out. The DCC once again manned an information booth and sponsored the photo booth, and Smith thanked all who volunteered.

Smith said the next Blue Streak Time Trial would be on June 10, and those interested can register on the Speedy Feet website. Smith also said he would not be able to attend the July meeting.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi reported that 99 people were signed up for the DCC's GOBA SAG service.

Director Dwaine Wheeler reported on this year's Huffman Spring Classic. He said it was a cold, windy and rainy day, but 36 brave riders came out and enjoyed the ride, food and entertainment.

Webmaster Jim Morgan asked if anyone has pictures from this year's banquet. He would like to share them on the DCC website. If you have photos to share, please forward them to him at dccweb7@gmail.com. Morgan also noted that registration for the Old World Tour registration is open on the website.

In old business, there was discussion of the need to form a nominating committee for the club elections in October.

In new business, the July business meeting was changed because many board members were going out of town for July 4 holiday week. The meeting was switched to 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 29, at Panera Bread on Brown Street. It will follow the Wright Wride planning meeting.

There being no further business, Smith moved to adjourn. Wert Minardi seconded the motion, and the board unanimously approved.
